Vienna, June 27. The Letters from Hungary lay, That the Vizier of Buda is encamped with a Body of 25000 Men hear Gran, with which he intends to pass the Danube, and afterwards to make an Incurfion into Filefis and Moravid. To prevent which, the Duke of Lorrain has detached a confiderable number of Men as well to reinforce G neral Schutz, as to enable he to defend the Pallages on the River Waag. The puties of Count Teckeley who refide here declared. That the 20th of the nixt Month their Mallers Troops will renew the Acts of Hollility; which were suspended by the late Truce concluded between the Emperour and the Count. The Emperour has constituted Morsi ur Straetman to be his Chancellour, in the place of Baron Hocker, lately deceased.

Vienna July 1. On Monday last the Sieur Straetman took the accustomed Oath of Chancellor to the Emperor, and fince his Imperial Majesty has been pleased to confer upon him the Dignity of a Barr of the Empire. The Duke of Saxen-Lawen-ber is returned to the Army with further In-fir tions to the Duke of Lorrain, how he shall govern himself in the present Juncture of Assairs. Several Expresses have of late been sent to the King of Poland, who is arrived at Cracow; according to our advices from thence, H's Majesty, as is faid, will march in Person with 20000 Men, to re-inforce the Emperor's Army in Hungary. The Duke of Lorrain having perfected the Fortifications of Rash, and re-inforced the Garison, with a considerable Body of Men, is posted wh the greatest part of the Imperial Army near unt In the mean time the Grand Vifier is advanced to Stat Weissemberg, within two hours of the Imperial Camp, with 50000 Foot, and 30000 Horse. Count Teckely continues with the Grand Vifer. The Emperor has fent Orders to Count Chackey, to destroy the Fortifications of Nitria, and to with-draw from thence the Artillery that was sent thither for the Desence of the Place. We have fresh advice that the Turks are encamped in the Mountains called Schilberg, and that the Duke of Lorrain continues posted with the Emperor's Forces in the Neighbourhood of Raab.

Ratubone, July 8. On Sunday last the Imperial Commissioner, the Bishop of Aichfads, delivered a Memorial to the Dyet on the part of the Emperour, in which, after a Deduction of what had been transacted at the late Assembly at Franck fort, and the hinderance put to the further Progress of the Treaty, by reason of the differences between the two Colledges here, several overtures are added to be made to France, viz. 1. That that Crown restore, all places that they have taken contrary to the Treaty of Munster, and ascertain the Damag's sustained
