A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R. .

THEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the twentieth day of this instant December; We, with the advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said twentieth day of this instant December, to Tuesday the twenty-second day of January next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said twenty-second day of January next, assemble and be held for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Boroughs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said twenty-second day of January next.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, this thirtcenth day of December one thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, and in the eighth year of Our reign.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act to regulate the trade of the British possess" sions abroad," it is, amongst other things, emeted, that no goods shall be imported into, nor shall arw goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, or from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, except into or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated or described in the table in the said Act of Parliament contained:

And it is thereby provided, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports, and it is enacted, that from and after the day mentioned in such Order in Council, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act.

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to the port of Charlotte Town, in Prince Edward's Island; His Majesty doth therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Act of Parliament, and with the advice of His Privy Council, order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the date of this Order, the provisions of the said Act of Parliament respecting free ports shall be, and the same are hereby, extended to the said port of Charlotte Town, in Prince Edward's Island:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right

Honourable William Huskisson, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An " Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions " abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that certain ports, therein particularly mentioned, in the island of Jamaica, and in the provinces of Nova Scotia, Canada, and New Brunswick, and in the island of Barbadoes, shall be free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act, and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, to appoint any port in His Majesty's possessions in America to be a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act; and that every such port, so appointed by His Majesty, shall be a free warehousing port under the said Act, as if appointed by the same, in as full and ample a manner in all respects as any of the ports thereinbefore mentioned and are free warehousing ports appointed by the said Act:

And whereas, His Majesty doth deem it expedient that certain other ports in His Majesty's possessions in America should be appointed free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers in him vested in and by the said Act of Parliament, order and appoint that the following ports in His Majesty's possessions in America shall be respectively free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say, port of Spain, in the island of Trinidad; Nassau, in the island of New Providence; Montego Bay, in the island of Jamaica; Roseau, in the island of Dominica; and Saint Andrews, in the province of New Providence:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Huskisson, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

#### PILOT-VESSELS.

T being found that the manner of distinguishing licenced Pilot-Vessels, directed by the 32d section of the Act of Parliament, 6th Geo. IV. c. 125, is not at all times effectual for that purpose, and the Corporation of Trinity-House having had the subject under consideration, with a view to the adoption of such additional marks as shall render the Pilot-Vessels licenced by them under the authority of the said Act, more readily distinguishable from all others at sea; notice is hereby given, that " in addition to the manner in which Pilot-Vessels are required to be distinguished by the 32d section of the Pilotage Act, 6 Geo. IV. c. 125, it is ordered by the Corporation of Trinity-House, that all Pilot-Vessels licenced by them shall, after the 1st of February 1828, have the number of such vessel, and the initial letter of the port to which she belongs, painted black on the mainsail and trysail thereof; that the figure or figures of such number and the initial letter of the port shall be six feet in length, and of proportionate breadth; and that the said number shall be placed immediately above the centre of the line from the throat to the leach of the mainsail, and the initial letter immediately beneath the said number; also that the licence of every Pilot-Vessel shall be immediately withdrawn on board of which, while actually holding a licence as such, any mainsail or trysail shall be found not marked in the manner herein before directed.
