T is this day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament, which was to meet on Tuesday the twenty-second day of this instant January, he further prorogued to Tuesday the twenty-ninth day of the said month, then to meet for the dispatch of business: And the Right Honourable the Lord High Chancellor of that part of the United Kingdom called Great Britain is to cause a commission to be prepared in the usual manner for proroguing the Parliament accordingly.

of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods shall be imported into, nor shall any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, or from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, except into or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated or described in the table in the said Act of Parliament contained:

And it is thereby provided, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of

the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports, and it is enacted, that from and after the day mentioned in such Order in Council, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, shall extend, and he deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act.

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to the port of Charlotte Town, in Prince Edward's Island; His Majesty doth therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Act of Parliament, and with the advice of His Privy Council, order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the date of this Order, the provisions of the said Act of Parliament respecting free ports shall be, and the same are hereby, extended to the said port of Charlotte Town, in Prince Edward's Island:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Huskisson, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An "Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions

" abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that certain ports, therein particularly mentioned, in the island of Jamaica, and in the provinces of Nova Scotia, Canada, and New Brunswick, and in the island of Barbadoes, shall be free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act, and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, to appoint any port in His Majesty's possessions in America to be a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act; and that every such port, so appointed by His Majesty, shall be a free warehousing port under the said Act, as if appointed by the same, in as full and ample a manner in all respects as any of the ports thereinbefore mentioned and are free warehousing ports appointed by the said Act:

And whereas, His Majesty doth deem it expedient that certain other ports in His Majesty's possessions in America should be appointed free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers in him vested in and by the said Act of Parliament, order and appoint that the following ports in His Majesty's possessions in America shall be respectively free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act, that is to say, Port of Spain, in the island of Trinidad; Nassau, in the island of New Providence; Montego Bay, in the island of Jamaica; Roseau, in the island of Dominica; and Saint Andrews, in the province of New Brunswick:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Huskisson, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actually set fire to the said respective premises) who shall discover their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

THE Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury having appointed money for the payment of half-pay to Sea Officers, from the 1st October to the 31st December last, according to His Majesty's establishment in that behalf; these are to give notice, that the several payments will begin to be made at the Pay-Office, by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, at ten o'clock in the morning, on the following days, viz.

- On the 4th, 5th, and 6th of February, to Admirals, Captains, and their Attornies.
- On the 7th, 8th, 11th, 12th, and 13th of February, to Lieutenants and Chaplains, and their Attornies.

And as by Act of Parliament, passed in the thirty-fifth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for establishing a more easy and expeditious method for the payment of Officers belonging to His Majesty's Navy," it is enacted by the twentieth clause of the said Act, "that if any Commissioned or Warrant Naval Officer who shall be entitled to receive half-pay, and shall be desirous to receive and be paid the same at or near the place of his residence, he may apply to the Treasurer of His Majesty's " Navy, in London, to have such half-pay paid "at or near the place of his residence, &c. in the manener pointed out by the said Act;" and by a further Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, initialed "An Act for " enabling the Officers in His Majesty's Navy, "and their representatives, to draw for and re-"ceive their half-pay," it is enacted by the first and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any "Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be en-" titled to receive any sum of money for or on account of his half-pay, shall be desirous of draw-" ing a bill of exchange for the same upon the "Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any "Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be en-" titled to receive any sum of money for or on account of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for the payment of wages for the Navy shall reside, in-stead of receiving the same by remittance bill or bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in London, or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, signifying such his desire;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 31st December last, will commence paying on the 4th February next; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.

MBM.—Bills of exchange drawn under or by virtue of the Act above recited, are not liable to the stamp duty.
