The new Bye-Laws or Regulations, above referred to, are as follow:

“That, instead of the general meeting which, in pursuance of the deed of settlement, is required to be held on the first Thursday in March, in every year, or within ten days thereof, and the general meeting which, by a bye-law duly passed on the 29th day of March last, is required to be held on the first Thursday in September in each year, or within ten days thereof, a general meeting shall be held on the first Thursday in the month of May in every year, or within ten days thereof, at which meeting is to be presented an account and statement, to be made up to and including the 31st day of December preceding, of all property, assets, debts, claims, contracts, engagements and liabilities of the Association, and also of the net profits or surplus (if any) which up to and including that day, shall have arisen from the business thereof, which particulars are required by the 42d clause of the deed of settlement; and another general meeting shall be held annually, on the first Thursday in the month of November, or within ten days thereof, at which meeting a like account and statement shall be presented, to be made up to and including the 30th day of June preceding, and to contain all the particulars required by the said 42d clause of the deed of settlement.

“That, at such general meetings respectively, such a sum (if any) as shall be fixed by the Directors, for the time being, after providing for the reservations mentioned in clause 43 of the deed of settlement shall, when confirmed by the resolution of the majority of the Proprietors present, and entitled to vote at such meetings, be declared divisible, as follows; that is to say, the net profits, up to and including the 31st day of December in every year, amongst the persons who were Proprietors, at Twelve o'Clock at Night, on the 15th day of April immediately following such 31st day of December; and the net profits, up to and including the 30th day of June in every year, amongst the persons
