All persons intending to offer themselves as candidates must send in their names with the places of their education, the universities in which they have taken their medical degrees, and the places where they have practised, both to the Register of Trinity College, Dublin, and to the Register of the King's and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland, to be by them laid before the two Colleges respectively.

#### NOTICE TO MARINERS.

##### LYNN WELL LIGHT.

Trinity-House, London, February 28, 1828.

**T**HE Corporation of Trinity-House having, in compliance with the request of a numerous body of merchants, owners, and masters of ships interested in the navigation through Lynn Well, caused a Floating Light Vessel to be placed off the Hook of the Longsand; notice thereof is hereby given, and that two lights, from separate lanterns of equal height, are now exhibited on board the said vessel every night from sun-set to sun-rise.

The Light Vessel is moored in 22½ fathoms at low water, with the following compass bearings, viz. The Buoy on the Longsand, N. W. distant half a mile.

Snettisham Church, S. ½ W.  
Hunstanton Light-House, S. ½ E.  
Brancaster Down, S. E. ½ E.  
Boston Church, W. by N.

Masters of vessels, pilots, and others are to observe, that in coming into the Well from the Lincolnshire Coast, they should bring the Light Vessel to bear S. W. by W. which will carry them half a mile to the eastward of the Lynn Knock, and after rounding her to the southward (allowing for tides,

the flood setting W. by N. in spring tide four to five miles per hour) they should steer W. S. W. about five miles, to an anchorage in ten or eleven fathoms at low water.
