#### A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.

HEREAS Thomas Earl of Kellie was duly elected and returned to be one of the sixteen Peers of Scotland, to sit in the House of Peers in the present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, and is since deceased; in order to the electing another Peer of Scotland to sit in his room, We do, byand with the advice of Our Privy Council, issue forth this Proclamation, strictly charging and commanding all the Peers of Scotland, to assemble and meet at Holyrood-House, in Edinburgh, on Thursday the tenth day of April next, between the hours of twelve and two in the afternoon, to sit and vote in the House of Peers of Scotland, to sit and vote in the House of Peers of this present Parliament of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, in the room of the said Thomas Earl of Kellie, deceased, by open election and plurality of voices of the Peers that shall then be present, and of the proxies of such as shall be absent (such proxies being Peers, and producing | a mandate in writing, duly signed before witnesses, and both constituent and proxy being duly qualified according to law), and the Lord Clerk Register, or such two of the Principal Clerks of the Session as shall be appointed by him to officiate in his name, are hereby respectively required to attend such meeting, and to administer the oaths required by law to be taken there by the said Peers, and to take their votes ; and immediately after such elec-. tion made and duly examined, to certify the name of the Peer so elected, and sign and attest the same in the presence of the said Peers the electors, and return such certificate into the High Court of Chancery of Great Britain. And We strictly charge and command that this Proclamation, be duly published at the Market-Cross at Edinburgh, and in all the county towns of Scotland, twentyfive days, at least, before the time hereby appointed for the meeting of the said Peers to proceed on such election.

VHEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act V " to regulate the trade of the British possessions " abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods shall be imported into, nor shall any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, or from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, except into or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated or described in the table in the said Act of Parliament contained :

And it is thereby provided, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports, and it is enacted, that from and after the day mentioned in such Order in 'Council, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, shall extend, and be deemed and -construed to extend, to any such port or ports respectively; as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of
