A T the Court at Windsor, the 13th day of February 1828,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act "to regulate the trade of the British possessions "abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods shall be imported into, nor shall any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, or from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, or some other of such possessions, except into or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated or described in the table in the said Act of Parliament contained:

And it is thereby provided, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or ports not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports, and it is enacted, that from and after the day mentioned in such Order in Council, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, shall extend, and he deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act:

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to the ports of Pictou and Sydney, in the province of Nova Scotia; His Majesty doth therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Act of Parliament, and with the advice of His

Privy Council, order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the date of this Order, the provisions of the said Act of Parliament respecting free ports shall be, and the same are hereby, extended to the said ports of Pictou and Sydney, in the province of Nova Scotia:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Huskisson, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THEREAS representations have been addressed to the Corporation of Trinity-House, on behalf of the owners of vessels importing lobsters from Norway or Scotland for the supply of the London market, on the subject of the light and other dues to the said Corporation to which those vessels are liable, and soliciting that an annual commutation might be paid in lieu thereof; and the same together with the liability to the said dues which equally applies to vessels importing turbots having undergone consideration.—This Corporation in compliance therewith, and by virtue of the authority vested in them by the 4th section of the Act of Parliament, 3d Geo. IV, cap. 111, have submitted certain propositions thereupon for the assent and confirmation of His Majesty in Council.—And His Majesty having been graciously pleased by an Order of Council, bearing date at the Court at Windsor, the 26th January 1828, to signify his royal assent to and confirmation thereof.

Notice is hereby given, that under authority of the same, the following annual commutation, subject to the conditions hereinafter stated, is to be paid by or in respect of the vessels beforementioned: that is to say, "That the sum of twenty shillings be paid annually in lieu of light and other duties payable to the Corporation of Trinity-House of Deptford Stroud, by all vessels importing lobsters from Norway or Scotland, and turbots from whatever part, for the supply of the London market, whether imported in British or in foreign vessels, provided the latter shall, in respect to duties to the said Corporation, be placed at the time of their making such annual payment on the footing of British vessels, and when such importations shall be made in foreign vessels not so privileged in respect of charges, the annual payment to be forty shillings each; that on payment of such commutation a certificate or receipt for the same be delivered, declaring that the said sum of twenty shillings or forty shillings, as the case may be, is in lieu of all light or other duties payable to the said Corporation to the 31st of December following the date of such payment, provided the cargo which such vessel may have on board shall not require her to make entry at the Custom-House, but that in all cases in which such entry shall be by law required, the full amount of light and other dues shall, as far as the same relate to that specific voyage, be paid as by other vessels making entry, but which entry and payment shall not invalidate the commutation in respect of any subsequent voyages in which entry at the Custom-House shall not be so required, provided such voyages shall take place within the period specified in the commutation receipt or certificate.
