WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, on the night of Friday the 18th, or early on the morning of Saturday the 19th instant, the office of Samuel Dethick, jun. and Company, situate near the Chesterfield Canal, in the parish of Worksop, in the county of Nottingham, was broken open and set fire to by some evil-disposed person or persons unknown, who burned, destroyed, and injured various books of accounts and other articles, the property of the said Samuel Dethick, jun. and Company;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony above mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set fire to the said office) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
