AT the Court at *St. James's*, the 7th day of May 1828,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the eighteenth of October last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder, salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), will expire on the twenty-third day of this instant May; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, and command, that no person or persons whatever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the twenty-third of this instant May), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, for the transporting of the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties imposed in that behalf by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the Customs:"

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Royal High-

ness the Lord High Admiral, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act for applying a sum of money out of the consolidated fund for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight.

An Act to repeal the stamp duties on cards and dice made in the United Kingdom, and to grant other duties in lieu thereof, and to amend and consolidate the Acts relating to such cards and dice and the exportation thereof.

An Act for further regulating the payment of the duties under the management of the Commissioners of Stamps on insurances from loss or damage by fire.

An Act to repeal so much of several Acts as empowers the Commissioners for the Reduction of the National Debt to grant life annuities.

An Act for repealing so much of several Acts as

imposes the necessity of receiving the sacrament of the Lord's Supper as a qualification for certain offices and employments.

An Act for rendering a written memorandum necessary to the validity of certain promises and engagements.

An Act to prevent a failure of justice by reason of variances between records and writings produced in evidence in support thereof.

An Act for lighting with gas the city of Lincoln, and the bail and close of Lincoln, in the county of Lincoln.

An Act for paving, lighting, watching, cleansing, regulating, and improving the vill and parish of the Cliffe, near Lewes, in the county of Sussex.

An Act for lighting, watching, and otherwise improving the town of Stalybridge, in the counties palatine of Lancaster and Chester, and for regulating the police thereof, and for establishing and regulating a market and erecting a market place within the said town.

An Act for paving, lighting, watching, and improving the city of Lincoln, and the bail and close of Lincoln, in the county of Lincoln, and for regulating the police therein.

An Act for making and maintaining a road from the town of Beaumaris to join the London and Holyhead post road, at or near to the Menai-bridge, all in the county of Anglesey.

An Act for repairing the road from Spernal Ash, in the county of Warwick, through Studley to Birmingham.

An Act for more effectually improving and keeping in repair the roads leading to and from the town of Great Torrington, in the county of Devon, and for making certain new lines of road to communicate with the same.

An Act for more effectually repairing the roads from the town of Cambridge to the Wadesmill turnpike road, in the parishes of Great Chishill and Little Chishill, in the county of Essex, and from the said town of Cambridge to Royston, in the county of Cambridge.

Whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third year of Our reign, intituled "An Act to repeal an Act, of the first and second year of His present Majesty, for facilitating the dispatch of business in the Court of King's-Bench, and to make further provisions in lieu thereof," it is, among other things, enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, it shall and may be lawful to and for Us, Our heirs and successors, and We and They are thereby authorised, from time to time, as to Us or Them shall seem meet, by Warrant under Our or Their Sign Manual, directed to the Judges of Our said Court, to direct and require the Judges of Our said Court, or any two or more of them, to meet at Serjeants-Inn-Hall, Westminster-Hall, or some other convenient place to be by them appointed, on such and so many days in the vacation or interval between any Terms as to Us, Our heirs and successors, shall seem fit and proper, for the dispatch of such matters, as at the end of the Term mentioned in such Warrant may be depending in Our said Court, whether on the Crown or Plea side thereof; and whereas We have been given to understand, that numerous matters are now depending in Our said Court, which cannot be dispatched during this present Easter Term, and which ought to be dispatched with all convenient speed; now, therefore, We do hereby, in pursuance of the said Act, direct and require you the Lord Chief Justice, and the other Judges of Our said Court before Us, or any two or more of you, to meet at Serjeants-Inn-Hall, Westminster-Hall, or some other convenient place to be by you appointed according to the said Act, on Tuesday the twentieth day of

May instant, and from thence daily until Saturday the twenty-fourth of the said month of May inclusive, and again on Monday the second day of June next, and from thence daily until Thursday the fifth day of the said month of June inclusive, for the dispatch of such matters as may be depending in Our said Court at the end of this present Easter Term, whether on the Crown or Plea side thereof; provided always, that if the attendance of any one of you at the Session of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for the county of Middlesex, or at any such Session or any Circuit, shall be found requisite, during any part of the time herein mentioned, and another of you shall also, during such attendance, be sitting for the trial of causes at Nisi Prius, then it shall be in the discretion of the remaining two of you either to meet or not to meet, in obedience hereto, according to the nature of the business that may be likely to come before you during such attendance.

"This adjoined sea mark will, together with the other ones on the coast of Lessøe and on Trindeln, until further, be kept on the spots pointed out on the charts of Cattegat per 1827, issued by the Danish Sea Chart Archive.

"It stands on the north east point of the grounds coming out from the Syrodde (the most easterly noze of Lessøe), in six fathoms water, one Danish mile, N. E. by compass, from the south easterly sea mark on the Trindeln.

"It consists of a pitched beam, with a large broom at the top, about 15 feet above the surface of the water."
