THIS day the Right Honourable William Lowther (commonly called Viscount Lowther); the Right Honourable Lieutenant-General Sir George Murray; the Right Honourable Sir Henry Hardinge; and the Right Honourable Thomas Peregrine Courtenay, were, by His Majesty's command, sworn of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took their respective places at the Board accordingly.

His Majesty having been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable George Earl of Aberdeen and the Right Honourable Lieutenant-General Sir George Murray to be two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, they were this day, by His Majesty's command, sworn two of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State accordingly.

His Majesty in Council was this day pleased to appoint the Right Honourable Thomas Peregrine Courtenay President of the Committee of Council appointed for the consideration of all matters relating to Trade and Foreign Plantations, in the absence of the President of the said Committee, for the time being.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the eighteenth of October last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder, salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to

any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), will expire on the twenty-third day of this instant May; and whereas it is judged expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, and command, that no person or persons whatever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the twenty-third of this instant May), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, for the transporting of the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties imposed in that behalf by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the Customs:"

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, His Royal Highness the Lord High Admiral, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

has honoured this meeting of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, has been received by us with sentiments of profound respect.

We entreat your Majesty to be assured, that our loyalty and affection to your Majesty's Person and Government remain unshaken, and that it shall be our earnest study to imitate that zeal for the interests of pure morality and religion, and that wisdom and discretion, which your Majesty condescends to approve in former Assemblies.

We consider it as a high encouragement in the discharge of our duties, that we are permitted to depend upon your Royal co-operation and support, and upon your Majesty's unalterable resolution to maintain the Church which we represent in the full possession of all its established rights and privileges.

The renewed appointment of the Right Honourable James O'Choncar Lord Forbes, to represent your Royal Person in this Assembly, we most gratefully acknowledge as a fresh instance of your Majesty's favour. The proof which he has already given of his qualifications for executing that high and important trust, ensures to him our most respectful and cordial reception.

The royal donation of £2000 for the propagation of Christian Knowledge in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland, we receive with lively gratitude; and we shall apply it with fidelity and diligence to the pious purpose for which it is given.

That Almighty God, by whom Kings reign, may bless your Majesty, and all the Members of your Royal House; that He may direct your Majesty's Councils, and prosper your Government, and that, after enjoying long the affection of a loyal and grateful people, you may receive a Heavenly Crown, are the prayers of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most obedient, and most loyal subjects, the Ministers and Elders of this General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.
