IT is this day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament be prorogued, from Thursday the thirtieth day of this instant October, to Thursday the eighteenth day of December next.

OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session, for leave to bring in a Bill, and to obtain an Act, for altering, amending, and enlarging the powers of the Commissioners of Sewers for the Tower Hamlets (excluding Saint Katharine's and Blackwall Marsh), in the county of Middlesex, to enable the said Commissioners to alter and amend the present sewers, drains, and other works, and to make new sewers, drains, outlets, and other necessary works and conveniences within the jurisdiction of the said Commissioners; to alter the mode of raising money by way of rates, and to enable them to compound for rates with certain landowners and others, and for raising money on the credit of the said rates; and for otherwise altering and amending the laws relating to sewers within the jurisdiction of the said Commissioners; and for other purposes relating thereto.-Dated this 22d day of October 1828.

an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the ninth year of the reign of King George the Second, in-tituled "An Act for the better regulating the nightly watch and beadles within the parish of Saint Paul, Covent-garden, within the liberties of the city of Westminster;" also (as far as such Act relates to or is applicable to the parish of Saint Paul, Covent-garden) an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fourteenth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled " An Act for the better regulation of the nightly watch and beadles within the city and liberty of Westminster and parts adjacent, and for other purposes therein contained; also an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fifteenth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to enable the inhabitants of the parish of Saint Paul, Coventgarden, in the county of Middlesex, to purchase or hire a convenient piece of ground for the purpose of erecting a workhouse thereon for the reception and employment of the poor of the said parish, and for providing an additional burial-ground for the use of providing an auditional ourial-ground for the use of the said parish;" also another Act of Parliament, made and passed in the twenty-third year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for better paving, cleans-ing, and lighting the parish of Saint Paul, Coventgarden, within the liberty of Westminster, and certain places adjoining thereto, and for removing and preventing nuisances and annoyances therein; also another Act of Parliament, made and passed in the twenty-eighth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for repairing the church of the parish of Saint Paul, Covent garden, in the county of Middlesex, for repairing and improving the gates and avenues leading to the said church, and for removing the present watch-house and providing another for the use of the said parish;" also another Act, made and passed in the twenty-ninth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An
