

Act to amend and enlarge the powers of an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, intituled "An Act for repairing the church of the parish of Saint Paul, Covent-garden, in the county of Middlesex, for repairing and improving the gates and avenues leading to the said church, and for removing the present watch-house and providing another for the use of the said parish;" also another Act of Parliament, made and passed in the thirty-sixth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for rebuilding the parish church of Saint Paul, Covent-garden, within the liberty of Westminster, in the county of Middlesex, and the vestry-rooms belonging thereto, for repairing and reinstating the iron rails inclosing the site of the said church and the gates leading thereto, and for making several regulations relating to the said parish;" and also another Act of Parliament, made and passed in the fifty-first year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for amending an Act of King Charles the Second, for making the precinct of Covent-garden parochial, and for increasing the stipends of the rector, curate, clerk, and sextons of the said parish;" and all other Acts of Parliament exclusively relating to the said parish; and also to authorise and empower the rate payers of the said parish annually to elect a committee, to consist of a certain number of the said rate payers, with a certain qualification, being resident householders of the said parish, to regulate, direct, and manage certain affairs relating to the said parish, and to regulate the manner of voting at parish or vestry meetings to be held in and for the said parish; and for giving powers to alter the several rates, assessments, and duties authorised by the above several Acts, or any of them, or to make any new rate or rates, assessment or assessments instead and in lieu thereof; and also to give powers for the paving or better paving, lighting, watching, repairing, cleansing, improving, watering, and regulating of the roads, streets, courts, alleys, ways, and places already existing, or hereafter to be formed and made, within the said parish of Saint Paul, Covent-garden; and for removing nuisances, annoyances, obstructions, and encroachments therein or thereon; and likewise to give powers for the making, assessing, collecting, managing, and regulating of the poor rates and other assessments of the said parish, and the government, maintenance, and employment of the poor thereof; and for making any new rate or rates, assessment or assessments, for and within the said parish, in such manner as may be necessary for all or any of the purposes aforesaid and relating to the general regulation of the affairs of the said parish; and finally, for the better management of the whole of the affairs of the said parish.
