Extract of a Letter from Captain Lyons, of His Majesty's Ship Blonde, to Vice-Admiral Sir Pulteney Malcolm, K. C. B. Commander in Chief of His Majesty's Squadron in the Mediterranean, dated off Morea-Castle, the 30th October 1828.

Senior Officer of His Most Christian Majesty's ships, I have had the good fortune of finding myself associated with those distinguished Officers, Captains Mauduit Duplessis, of La Duchesse de Berri; Hugon, of L'Armide; and Villeneuve, of La Didon; and in detailing the proceedings of the Blonde, I at the same time describe those of the French frigates, for I assure you, that throughout an arduous service of twelve days and nights, in very unfavourable weather, the most perfect concert and hearty cooperation have been invariably manifested.

On the 18th instant, General Schneider expressed a wish that four eighteen-pounders should be landed from each ship; and in less than four hours they were on shore, with all their appointments; the difficulties occasioned by the surf on the beach being overcome by the fine spirit which animated all, French and English being in the water mutually assisting each other. In this operation, the zeal and intelligence of Lieutenant Saumarez Brock were very conspicuous.

On the 20th instant, Lieutenants Luckraft and Dacres; Messrs. Mockler, Hay, Blair, and Austen,

Mates; and Messrs. de Saumarez, Kennedy, Hawkins, and Dor, Midshipmen, landed with a party of seamen, and commenced making the batteries, under the direction of the French Officers of Engineers and Artillery.

At nine o'clock on the 22d, the battery opened its fire on Morea Castle, and in a few hours silenced the guns opposed to it; but as the army advanced in their approaches to the breaching battery, the Castle opened fresh guns, which rendered it necessary for the marine battery to fire, at intervals, for eight days and nights.

Last evening, the guns of the frigates, with two twenty-four-pounders, which Admiral de Rigny landed from the Conquerant on his arrival, and such of the battering train as the weather enabled us to disembark, were fairly established in the two breaching batteries, named by General Maison, Charles X. and George IV. the French and English guns being promiscuously placed in each; and at day-light this morning, together with the mortar battery and the Ætna bomb, opened such a tremendous fire on the Castle as to produce, in four hours, an unconditional surrender.

I am sure you will be glad to find, that the zeal and professional talent exhibited by Captain Lushington, his Officers, and ship's company, have excited the admiration of all.

The Ætna was worked up in the night, under reefed courses and close reefed topsails, anchored, and sprung, with such precision, within eight hundred yards of the Castle, as to enable that intelligent Officer, Lieutenant Logan, of the royal marine artillery, to throw one hundred and two shells into the Castle, only the first four going too far. Captain Lushington assures me, that he received the most valuable assistance from Lieutenant Walker.

The King has been graciously pleased to nominate and appoint John Henry Lance, Esq. to be His Mariesty's Commissary; Judge, in the room of Christopher Edward Le Froy, Esq.; and Campbell James Dalrymple, Esq. to be His Majesty's Commissioner of Arbitration, in the room of John Henry Lance, Esq. to the Mixed British and Netherland Commission established at Surinam, under the Treaty concluded on the 4th of May 1818, between His Majesty and the King of the Netherlands, for the prevention of illegal traffic in Slaves, and pursuant to the Act of Parliament passed for carrying that Treaty into effect.

Whereas by an Act, passed in the session of Parliament holden in the third year of Our reign, intituled "An Act to repeal an Act, of the first and second year of His present Majesty, for facilitating the dispatch of business in the Court of tating the dispatch of business in the Court of King's-Bench, and to make further provisions in lieu thereof," it is, among other things, enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, it shall and may be lawful to and for Us, Our heirs and successors, and We and They are thereby authorised, from time to time, as to Us or Their Sign Manual, directed, to, they Judges of Our said Court, to direct and require the Judges of Our said Court, or any two, or more of them, to meet at Serjeants-Inn-Hall, Westminster-Hall, or some other convenient place to be by them appointed, on such venient place to be by them appointed, on such and, so many days in the vacation or interval between any Terms as to Us, Our heirs and successors, shall seem fit and proper, for the dispatch of such matters, as at the end of the Term mentioned in such Warrant may be depending in Our said Court, whether on the Crown or Plea side thereof; and whereas We have been given to understand, that numerous matters are now depending in Our said Court, which cannot be dispatched during this present Michaelmas Term, and which ought to be dispatched with all convenient speed; now, therefore, We do hereby, in pursuance of the said Act, direct and require you the Lord Chief Justice, and the other Judges of Our said Court before Us, or any two or more of you, to meet at Serjeants-Inn-Hall, Westminster-Hall, or some other convenient place to be by you appointed according to the said Act, on Monday the eighth day of December next, and from thence daily until and upon Saturday the twentieth day of that month, and again on Tuesday the thirteenth day of January next, and from thence daily until and upon Thursday the twenty-second day of January next, for the dispatch of such matters as may be depending in Our said Court at the end of this present Michaelmas Term, whether on the Crown or Plea side thereof; provided always, that if the attendance of any one of you at the Session of Oyer and Terminer and Gaol Delivery for the county of Middlesex, or at any such Session or any Circuit, shall be found requisite, during any part of the time herein mentioned, and another of you shall also, during such attendance, be sitting for the trial of causes at Nisi Prius, then it shall be in the discretion of the remaining two of you either to meet or not to meet, in obedience hereto, according to the nature of the business that may be likely to come before you during such attendance.

THE following is the copy of an Order in Council, approving of a district being assigned to the chapel at Old Brentford, in the parish of Ealing, in the county of Middlesex:

At the Court at St. James's, the 28th of June 1828, present, the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," it is amongst other things enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act, shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the Bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his or their consent to make such division, and

for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto, under his or their hand and seal, and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of such patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall. state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective: proportions of glebe lands, tithes, moduses, or other. endowments, which will by such division arise and accrue and remain and be within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits, which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if thereupon His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and whereas by the said Act it is further enacted, "that. in any case in which the said Commissioners shall ... be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete separate and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the Bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary, for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels: to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendance of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such divisions:" and whereas by an Act, passed in the 59th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes, further provisions are made for carrying such division into effect: and whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that the parish of Ealing, in the county of Middlesex and diocese of London, contained in the year 1821, when the last census was taken, a population of 6608 persons, which has considerably increased since that time; that the parish church and one chapel are the only conse-

crated places of worship in the parish, which afford accommodation for 1:470 persons; the church accommodating .070, and the chapel, which is situate at Old Brentford, about 400 persons; that it appears to the said Commissioners to be expedient, for securing a due ecclesiastical superintendance of the parish, and for the improvement of the moral and religious babits of the persons residing therein, that an ecclesinstical district should be assigned to the chapel at Old Brentford, under the provisions of the said Acts; that such district should be called Old Brentford District, and that the boundaries thereof should be as follows: the boundary line to be determined on the south and west by the boundaries of the said parish of Ealing; on the north to commence at that point in Bollow-bridge-lane where the said lane is entered by the bridle road and footpath called the Longwalk; it proceeds thence, in a westerly direction, across the White Post Fields to the south east corner of Gunnersbury-park, to follow the south wall of the same to the western extremity thereof; thence across Old Brentford Common Field to the northern hedge or boundary of the Clay Pond Farm; thence to Doum-lane, crossing the same close to the north wall of certain premises, the property of Mr. Hope, and occupied as a school by Mr. Holsworth; thence across certain fields, the property of Mr. John Clarke and others, to the northern extremity of Prospect-place, in Windmill-lane; and thence across certain gardens, the property of Mr. Stevenson, now occupied by Mr. Negers, to the northern extremity of Boston-row, in Boston-road, where it terminates in ther boundary line which separates the parish of Ealing from the township and chapelry of New Brentford; in the parish of Hanwell, which is more particularly described in the map accompanying the said representation: that the consent of the Lord Bishop of the diocese has been obtained, as required by the said Act, passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign; and humbly praying, that His Majesty would be pleased to take the said circumstances into consideration, and to make such order therein as to His Majesty should seem meet: His Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed division, be accordingly made and effected, agree-ably to the provisions of the said Acts.
