THEREAS by a certain Act of Parliament, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the "trade of the British possessions abroad," after reciting, that "by the Law of Navigation foreign " ships are permitted to import into any of the "British possessions abroad, from the countries to which they belong, goods, the produce of those countries, and to export goods from such posses-" sions to be carried to any foreign country what-" ever, and that it is expedient that such permission " should be subject to certain conditions," it is enacted, "that the privileges thereby granted to foreign ships shall be limited to the ships of those " countries which, having colonial possessions, shall grant the like privileges of trading with those possessions to British ships, or which, not having colonial possessions, shall place the commerce and navigation of this country, and of its posses-" sions abroad, upon the footing of the most favoured shall be construed to extend, to make void or angul

" nation, unless His Majesty, by His Order in " Council, shall in any case deem it expedient to grant the whole or any of such privileges to the " ships of any foreign country, although the con-" ditions aforesaid shall not in all respects be fulfilled by such foreign country:"

And whereas by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth years of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the "Customs," after reciting or taking notice of the said Act so passed as aforesaid in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign, and after reciting, that unless some period were limited for the fulfilment by foreign countries of the conditions mentioned and referred to in the said recited Act, the trade and navigation of the United Kingdom and of the British possessions abroad, could not be regulated by fixed and certain rules, but would continue subject to changes dependent upon the laws from time to time made in such foreign countries; it is therefore enacted, that no foreign country shall hereafter be deemed to have fulfilled the conditions so prescribed as aforesaid in and by the said Act, as to be entitled to the privileges therein mentioned, unless such foreign country had in all respects fulfilled those conditions within twelve months next after the passing of the said Act, that is to say, on or before the fifth day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-six; and for the better ascertaining what particular foreign countries are permitted by law to exercise and enjoy the said privileges, it is further enacted, that no foreign country shall hereafter be deemed to have fulfilled the beforementioned conditions, or to be entitled to the privileges aforesaid, unless and until His Ma-jesty shall by some Order or Orders to be by him made, by the advice of His Privy Council, have declared that such foreign country hath so fulfilled the said conditions, and is entitled to the said privileges; provided always, and it is thereby declared and enacted, that nothing therein contained, extends, or

any Orde or Orders in Council theretofore issued, under the authority or in pursuance of the said recited Act, or to take away or abridge the powers vested in His Majesty in and by the said Act, or any of those powers, any thing therein contained to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding:

And whereas the conditions mentioned and referred to in the said Acts of Parliament have not in all respects been fulfilled by the Government of His Most Catholic Majesty the King of Spain, and therefore the privileges so granted as aforesaid by the Law of Navigation to foreign ships, cannot lawfully be exercised or enjoyed by the ships of Spain, unless His Majesty, by His Order in Council, shall grant the whole or any of such privileges to such Spanish ships:

And whereas His Majestv, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth deem it expedient to grant the privileges aforesaid, in certain cases, to ships of the dominions of His Most Catholic Majesty the King of Spain, His Majesty doth therefore, by the advice aforesaid, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers and authority in him vested by the said recited Acts of Parliament, declare and grant, that it shall and may be lawful for Spanish ships to import into any of the British possessions abroad, from the colonies and foreign plantations of His Most Catholic Majesty, goods, the produce of those colonies and possessions, and to export goods from such British possessions abroad, to be carried to any foreign country whatever:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable William Huskisson, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain. Jas. Buller.

THE following is the copy of an Order in Council, approving of districts being assigned to the new chapels built at Shipley and Wilsden, in the parish of Bradford, in the county of York:

At the Court at St. James's, the 30th of May 1828, present, the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," it is amongst other things enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act, shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the Bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his or their consent to make such divisions, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto, under his or their hand and seal, and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall. state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe lands, tithes, moduses, or other endowments, which will by such divisions arise and accrue and remain and be within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues and profits, which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if thereupon His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such divisions to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such divisions; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and whereas by the said Act it is further enacted, " that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parishes, or extra parochial place, into such complete separate and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the Bishop, signified under his hand and scal, may deem necessary, for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all

ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendance of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such divisions to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:" and whereas by an Act, passed in the 59th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled " An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect: and whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that the parish of Bradford, in the county and diocese of York, contained in the year 1821, when the last census was taken, a population of 52,954 persons, which has considerably increased since that time; that besides the parish church there are only five consecrated chapels, which together afford accommodation for 6004 persons only; that the said Commissioners have caused to be erected two new chapels in the said parish, one at Shipley and the other at Wilsden, wherein accommodation has been provided for 2976 persons, including 664 free seats appropriated to the use of the poor; that such chapels have been consecrated and divine service is regularly performed therein; that it appears to the said Commissioners to be expedient, for securing a due ecclesiastical superintendance of the parish, and for the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, that districts should be assigned to the new chapels, under the said Act passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign; and that such districts should be named, Shipley cum Heaton District, and Wilsden cum Allerton District; that their boundaries should be as follows: the boundary of Shipley and Heaton District to commence at the bridge called Baildon-bridge, which connects the towns of Shipley and Baildon, and to comprise the land on the south of the River Aire from the mouth of the Bradford Beck to the bridge called Darley Gap-bridge, where the parish of Bradford joins the parish of Bingley, and in a westerly direction, Bingley being on the right and Shipley on the left, at the distance of about three miles, extends the extremity of the township of Heaton, contiguous to which is the township of Allerton on the west, and in an easterly view continues the limits of the township of Heaton to the rivulet called the Bradford Beck, which, by a winding course of about two miles, and separating the townships of Heaton and Shipley from the township of Idle, empties itself into the River Aire at Baildonmill, which district is described in the map accompanying the said representation; the boundary of Wilsden cum Allerton District to commence at Harden Beck-bridge, which connects the parish of Bradford with the parish of Bingley, and to proceed in a south westerly direction along the watercourse which is the boundary of Bingley parish, by Goitstock and

Cullingworth as far as Iverstone-bridge, over which is the Halifax and Haworth turnpike road; thence in the same direction along the boundary of Bingley parish as far as Oxenhope; thence in a south direction along the boundary of Haworth by Oxenhope to the south western extremity of Hallows-park; thence in a north eastern direction along the boundary of Denholme cum Thornton, crossing the Halifax and Keighley turnpike road, and onward in an easterly direction along the same boundary as far as the road, across Old Allen-common to Wilsden, is joined by Allerton; thence along the same boundary to the watercourse, which proceeding in a south easterly direction is the boundary of Thornton, as far as Lenthrop-mill-bridge; thence along the same watercourse in an easterly direction, being the boundary of Clayton, and then of Great Horton at Sam's-mill, up to its junction with another water-course where Manningham joins Allerton; thence along the last watercourse in a north westerly di-rection, being the boundary of Manningham, and-then of Heaton to Lane Bottom on the Bradford and Haworth road; thence along a small run of water to where the parish of Bingley joins the parish of Bradford, and onward in a north westerly direction along the boundary of Bingley parish, as far as the watercourse which going in a westerly direction is the boundary of Bingley parish; and thence along this watercourse to Harden Beck-bridge, which district is described in the map accompanying the said representation: that the consent of His Grace the Lord Archbishop of York has been obtained, as required by the aforesaid Act; and humbly praying, that His Majesty would be pleased to take the said circumstances into consideration, and to make such order therein as to His Majesty should seem meet: His Majesty having this day taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed division be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

NOTICE TO MARINERS. CAPE WRATH LIGHT-HOUSE.

THE Commissioners of the Northern Light-houses hereby give notice, that a Light-house has been erected upon Cape Wrath, in the county of Sunderland; the light of which will be exhibited on the night of Thursday the 25th day of December next, and every night thereafter, from the going away of day-light in the evening till the return of day-light in the morning.

The following is a Specification of the Position of the Light-House, and the Appearance of the Light, by Mr. Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners:

Cape Wrath forms the north western extremity of the main land of Scotland, in lat. 58 deg. 36 min. north, and in long. 4 deg. 56 min. west. By compass it bears from Hoyhead in Orkney, west, distant 45 miles; from the Butt of the Lewis, E.S.E. ¼ E. distant 41 miles; from the Rocks called the Stags of the Cape, S.W. by W. ¼ W. distant about one

mile; from the Sunken Rock called the Nun, S.S.W. 3 W. distant 15 miles; and from the Islands of Stack and Skerry, W. S. W. the former 28, and the latter 30 miles distant. This light will be known to Mariners as a revolving light, exhibiting from one and the same lantern a light of the natural appearance, alternating or changing with one tinged red; which two kinds of light successively attain their most luminous effect every two minutes, and thereafter becoming gradually less luminous, are to a distant observer totally eclipsed for a short time. lantern light-room is elevated 400 feet above the medium level of the sea. The light of the natural appearance will, in clear weather, be seen like a star of the first magnitude, at the distance of eight or nine leagues, and at lesser distances, according to the state of the atmosphere; but the red light being somewhat obscured by the coloured shades, will not be seen at so great a distance.


