The loyal and dutiful Address of the Mayor, Bailiffs, Burgesses, Recorder, Town Clerk, and other Inhabitants of the Borough of New Windsor, in the County of Berks.

May it please your Majesty,

WE, the Mayor, Bailiffs, Burgesses, Recorder, Town Clerk, and other Inhabitants of the borough of New Windsor, most humbly and respectfully approach your Majesty, to renew to your Majesty the expression of those feelings of loyal satisfaction with which we hailed the first moment when the Castle of Windsor became the favoured place of your Royal Residence.

Since that period the restoration and improvement of that venerable and superb seat of a long line of British Monarchs, under the tasteful auspices of your Majesty (the enlightened Judge and magnanimous Patron of the Arts), have proceeded with a success, combining at once the grand and the beautiful, and exhibiting a splendour adapted to the illustrious Sovereign of these realms.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Thursday the eighteenth day of this instant December; We, with the advice of our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said eighteenth day of this instant December, to Thursday the fifth day of February next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said fifth day of February next, assemble and be held for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Boroughs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their

attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said fifth day of February next.

Given at Our Court at Windsor, this fifteenth day of December, one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, and in the ninth year of Our reign.

AT the Court at Windsor, the 24th day of November 1828,

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS the time limited by His Majesty's Order in Council, of the seventh of May last, for prohibiting the exportation of gun-powder, salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar), has expired; and whereas it is deemed expedient that the said prohibition should be continued for some time longer; His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, doth therefore hereby order, require, and command, that no person or persons whatever (except the Master-General of the Ordnance for His Majesty's Service), do, at any time during the space of six months (to commence from the date of this Order), presume to transport any gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, to any port or place on the Coast of Africa (except to any ports or places within the Streights of Gibraltar) or ship or lade any, gun-powder or salt-petre, or any sort of arms or ammunition, on board any ship or vessel, for the transporting of the same into any such ports or places on the Coast of Africa (except as above excepted), without leave or permission in that behalf first obtained from His Majesty or His Privy Council, upon pain of incurring and suffering the respective forfeitures and penalties imposed in that behalf by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for the general regulation of the Customs."

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, and His Majesty's Secretary at War, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

And also to command, that this His Majesty's concession and especial mark of His royal favour, together with the relative documents, be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms.

WHEREAS it has been humbly represented to the King, that, on the night of Wednesday the 19th of November last, an outrageous assault was committed near Constantine Church-town, in the parish of Constantine, in the county of Cornwall, upon the persons of two Officers of the Customs, while employed in their duty at the said place, in the prevention of smuggling, by a large party of smugglers, who were armed with pistols, bludgeons, and knives, and who violently assaulted the said Officers, and succeeded in rescuing a large quantity of spirits;

His Majesty, for the better discovering of the offenders concerned in the commission of this outrage, is hereby pleased to offer His most gracious pardon to any one or more of them present at, and aiding in, such outrage (save and except those who actually assaulted and beat the said Officers), who shall discover his or their accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he or they may be apprehended and brought to justice.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, about two o'clock on the morning of Thursday the 20th of November last, the dwelling-house of the Reverend William Warrington, of West Moalsey, in the county of Surrey, was broken into by several men; that a pistol was twice snapped at the head of Mr. Warrington; that he was knocked down by a blow from a poker, and received a severe blow on his hand; and, after having his hands and feet tied, was, with Mrs. Warrington and two female servants, put into a damp vault in the cellar; that the house was robbed of a quantity of plate, two watches, and some money; and that the stable was afterwards broken open, and a horse and phaeton stolen therefrom;
