SCHOOL OF PHYSIC IN IRELAND.

WHEREAS the King's Professorship of the Practice of Medicine, on the foundation of Sir Patrick Dun, is now vacant, notice is hereby given, that an election for said Professorship will be held at the house of the Provost of Trinity College, Dublin, on Tuesday the 26th day of May next, at twelve o'clock at noon. The emoluments of said Professorship consist of such fees for lectures as may be regulated by the President and Fellows of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland; said fees being at present, four guineas paid by each Student for admission to each course of lectures on the Practice of Medicine; of three guineas paid by each Student for each course of Clinical Lectures; and of a fixed annual salary of one hundred pounds, late Irish currency. Said Professorships are open to persons of all nations, professing their faith in Christ, provided they shall have taken medical degrees, or shall have obtained a licence to practice from the said College of Physicians, in consequence of a testimonium under the seal of Trinity College, Dublin.

All persons intending to offer themselves as Candidates must send in their names, with the places of their education, the Universities in which they have taken their medical degrees, and the places where they have practiced, both to the Register of Trinity College, Dublin, and to the Register of the King and Queen's College of Physicians in Ireland, to be by them laid before the two Colleges respectively.
