Westminster, June 4, 1829.

THIS day, the Lords being met, a message was sent to the Honourable House of Commons by the Gentleman Usher of the Black Rod, acquainting them, that *The Lords, authorised by virtue of a Commission under the Great Seal, signed by His Majesty, for declaring His Royal Assent to several Acts agreed upon by both Houses, do desire the immediate attendance of the Honourable House in the House of Peers to hear the Commission read; and the Commons being come thither, the said Commission, empowering the Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, the Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, and several other Lords therein named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to*

An Act to enable one or more of the Commissioners of Excise, to act for the dispatch of business for Scotland and Ireland respectively.

An Act for the more effectual punishment of attempts to murder, in certain cases, in Scotland.

An Act for consolidating and amending the Statutes, in Ireland, relating to offences against the person.

An Act to amend the several Acts for the encouragement of the Irish fisheries.

An Act to amend the laws relating to Coroners in Ireland.

An Act to prevent arrests upon mesne process, where the debt or cause of action is under twenty pounds; and to regulate the practice of arrests in Ireland.

An Act to continue, until the end of the next session of Parliament, and to amend the Acts for the relief of insolvent debtors, in Ireland.

An Act for better supplying the East London Water Works with water, and amending the several Acts relating to the said Water Works.

An Act to incorporate certain persons to be called

"the Independent Gas Light and Coke Company;" and for enabling them to light with gas certain parishes in the county of Middlesex.

An Act to alter, amend, and enlarge the powers of several Acts, passed for holding a market in the parish of Saint Saviour, in the borough of Southwark, in the county of Surrey; and for granting more effectual provisions for that purpose.

An Act for maintaining the pier at Sheerness, in the parish of Minster, in the isle of Sheppy, in the county of Kent.

An Act for paving, lighting, watching, cleansing, and improving certain streets and public passages and places at Sheerness, in the parish of Minster, in the isle of Sheppy, in the county of Kent.

An Act to enable the Edinburgh and Dalkeith Railway Company to raise a further sum of money to make a branch from the said Railway to Leith; and for other purposes relating thereto.

An Act to authorise the raising a further sum of money for completing the drainage and navigation by the River Witham; and for amending the Acts relating thereto.

And four private Acts.
