WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented
unto the King, that, about twelve o'clock
on the night of Friday the 15th ultimo, Robert
Davis, the Deputy Constable of Warrington, in the
county of Lancaster, being in his gig on his return
home, after conveying some prisoners to the House
of Correction at Kirkdale, in the said county, was,
within a short distance of the chapel of the township
of Sankey, feloniously and maliciously shot at by
some evil-disposed person unknown, with a gun or
pistol, the ball of which passed through his hat;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and
bringing to justice the persons concerned in the
felony before mentioned, is hereby pleased to pro-
mise His most gracious pardon to any one of
them (except the person who actually shot at the
said Robert Davis) who shall discover his accom-
plice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or
they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

(except as aforesaid) who shall discover the said

the trial of offences committed on the High Seas
within the jurisdiction of the Admiralty of Eng-
land, will be held at Justice-Hall, in the Old
Bailey, London, on Tuesday the 14th of July
next, at eight o'clock in the morning.

And all Sheriffs, Gaolers, and Keepers of Prisons,
in whose custody any prisoners, charged with
offences committed on the High Seas, or within
the said jurisdiction, may be, are hereby re-
quired to transmit a copy of the commitment
of every such prisoner to Mr. Charles Jones, the
Solicitor of the Admiralty, at his Office, No. 10,
Lancaster-place, Strand, London, in order that
the necessary measures may be taken, for re-
moving all such prisoners to His Majesty's Gaol
of Newgate, for trial at the said intended ses-
sion. And all Mayors, Justices, Coroners, and
other Officers, before whom any inquisitions, in-
formations, examinations, or recognizances may
have been taken touching any such offences, are
required to transmit the same forthwith to Mr.
Thomas Shelton, the Clerk of Arraigns of the
High Court of Admiralty of England, at his Office,
at the Sessions-house, in the Old Bailey, London.
