THE following is a copy of an Order in Council, approving of a district being assigned to the new chapel built in the parish of Prestwich, in the county of Lancaster:

At the Court at Windsor, the 25th of February 1829, present, the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," it is amongst other things enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act, shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners with the consent of the Bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal, and the said Commissioners shall upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe lands, tithes, moduses, or other endowments, which will by such division arise and accrue and remain and be within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions,

and if thereupon His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided; and whereas by the said Act it is further enacted "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete separate and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts, as they with the consent of the Bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary, for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending Divine Service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendance of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein; the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if thereupon His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:" and whereas by an Act passed in the 59th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes:" further provisions are made for carrying such division into effect: and whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that in the year 1821, when the last census was taken, the parish of Prestwich, in the county of Lancaster and diocese of Chester, contained a population of 14,424 persons, which has since considerably increased; that besides the parish church there are only two consecrated chapels, which together afford accommodation for 1750 persons; that the said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that they have caused a new chapel to be erected in the said parish, wherein accommodation has been provided for 1838 persons, including 978 free sittings appropriated to the use of the poor; that this chapel has been consecrated, and divine service is regularly performed therein; that the said Commissioners beg leave further to represent to your Majesty, that having taken into consideration all the circumstances attending this parish, it appears to them to be expedient, for securing a due ecclesiastical superintendance of the parish, and for the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, that a district should be assigned to the new

chapel, under the provisions of the 21st section of the Act of the 58th year of the reign of His late Majesty, and that such district should be named, Stand District, with boundaries as follows:—District to All Saints Chapel, Stand; the boundary on the east to commence on the southern side of the River Roach, and to be continued on the western side of the old road leading to Bury, past some houses called Old Brow; from thence to the east, across the present turnpike road to Bury, to a place called Bumbards; from thence in a southerly direction past a farm called Prestwich Fold, to a village named the Common, across the road leading to Unsworth, where the boundary makes a short diversion to the north, along a brook which falls into the Roach; from thence past a village called the Hillocks, crossing the road at Oak-gate, it is continued on through some meadows to Barton Close; from there to a village called Cuckoo Nest, along the road leading from thence into the Manchester turnpike road, which it crosses, and proceeds at the back of the houses of the village of Kirkhams, into the Manchester road at the fifth mile stone, near to a public house called the Coach and Horses; from thence along the western side of the Manchester road, near a place called Thatchleach; from there continuing in a southerly direction past Hardman's-green, across the new road from Bury to Manchester, to Hardman's Fold; and from there to a place called Ox-gate, at the junction of two brooks in some lands belonging to Robert Phillips, Esq. of the Park: the boundary on the west is continued from Ox-gate along the course of one of the brooks before mentioned, in a north westerly direction across Park-lane, to a place called the Cloggers; from thence in a south westerly direction to a place named Slack, situated on the road leading from Molineux to Stand, along the western side of the same road to Carter's New Barn; and from thence to a village called Outwood-gate, situated on the road leading from Stand to Kingsley; then in a northerly direction along the western side of the road leading from Outwood gate to Radcliffe, to a certain point; and from there in a westerly direction past a place called Howler-hall, down to the River Irwell: the northern boundary is continued along the southern bank of the River Irwell to a point nearly opposite the Rectory-house at Radcliffe, where it crosses to Irwell, and embraces four fields on the other side; it then crosses the river again, and is continued on the southern side of the Irwell, as before, to its junction with the River Roach; from whence it is continued to the point where the boundary on the eastern side commences; which district comprises the whole of the hamlet of Whitefield, and is described in the map or plan accompanying this representation: that the consent of the Lord Bishop of the diocese has been obtained as required by the before-mentioned section of the Act of Parliament; that the said Commissioners beg leave, therefore, to lay before your Majesty the before-mentioned circumstances, and humbly to pray that your Majesty will be graciously pleased to take the premises into your royal consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to your Majesty in your wisdom shall seem meet; His Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as

it is hereby ordered, that the proposed division be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts. *Jas. Buller.*
