His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually threw the viriol into the face of the said John Moseley Smith) who shall discover his accomplices or accomplises they are the the discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
