WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that divers acts of outrage have lately been committed on the persons and property of certain individuals in the town and neighbourhood of Barnsley, in the county of York; and that, between the hours of eight and nine o'clock on the evening of Thursday the 27th ultimo, the house

of Mr. Thomas Jackson, situate near Barnsley, was violently and riotously attacked, the windows smashed, the entrance forced, and considerable damage done to the furniture: and whereas it hath been also humbly represented unto the King, that, on the night of Wednesday the 2d instant, a barn, in the possession of Mr. Edward Jackson and his copartners, at Barnsley, was feloniously broken into and set fire to and totally destroyed, together with a quantity of machinery, looms, files, and other apparatus thereto belonging;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in planning, advising, and assisting in the outrages before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of the parties concerned in the aforesaid felonies respectively (except the person or persons who actually set fire to the barn in the possession of Mr. Edward Jackson) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
