HAGUE'S INVENTION OF CERTAIN IMPROVEMENTS IN THE METHOD OF EXPELLING THE MOLASSES OR SYRUP FROM SUGAR.

WHEREAS His late Majesty King George the Third, by letters patent under the Great Seal of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, bearing date the 27th day of July 1816, granted to John Hague, formerly of Great Pearl-street, Spital-fields, in the county of Middlesex, but now of Cable-street, in the parish of St. George in the East, in the said county, engineer, his executors, administrators,

and assigns, the sole privilege and authority, for and during the term of fourteen years from the date of the said letters patent, to make, use, exercise, and vend the invention of the said John Hague, "of certain improvements in the method of expelling the molasses or syrup from sugar," within that part of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland called England, Wales, and the town of Berwick-upon-Tweed; which invention consists in an improved method of expelling the molasses or syrup from sugar, by passing air through the sugar; notice is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the next session thereof, for leave to bring in a Bill for prolonging the term of the said letters patent.

WEST INDIA SOUTH DOCK.

Light vessels, which have not discharged in either of the docks, for any period not exceeding six weeks from the date of entering, per ton register, 6d.

Vessels, with herrings, dried fish, provisions, or other goods, not remaining beyond two weeks, per ton register, 6d.

Sloops and craft, coastwise, with bricks, for delivery on board ships, not remaining beyond one week, per ton register, 3d.

Vessels which have re-entered after having left either dock for repair, are to pay the dock rent of $\frac{3}{4}$ d per ton register per week only, from the expiration of the time allowed, under the rate incurred at her previous entry.

Dock rent for remaining over the periods above specified, per ton register, per week, $\frac{3}{4}$ d.

Steam boats to lay up, for any period not exceeding four weeks, per ton, Builder's measurement, 6d.;

and rent, after the first four weeks, per ton per week, Builder's measurement, 1d.

These rates do not include the expence of docking, mooring, unmooring, and removing.

N. B.—The lock-gates of this dock will not be opened for the admission of vessels before half-flood, or after high water.
