HEREAS by an Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to empower His Majesty to suspend the ballot or enrolment for the local militia," it is enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by " Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions

any Order in Council, to direct that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia shall take place, but that such ballot and enrolment shall remain and continue suspended for the period specified in any such; Order in Council, and from time to time by any like Order or Orders in Council, to continue such suspension as long as His Majesty shall deem the same expedient, any thing in any Act or Acts of Parliament to the contrary notwithstanding; and whereas by an Order in Council, made the twenty-eighth of June one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, it was ordered by His Majesty in Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia should take place for the space of one year from the sixteenth of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-eight, but that the ballot should remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from the said sixteenth of July; and whereas it is deemed expedient to continue such suspension of the ballot and enrolment for the local militia for the space of one year from the date of this Order; it is, therefore, ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, that no ballot or enrolment for the local militia do take place for the space of one year from the date of this Order, but that the ballot and enrolment for the local militia do remain and continue suspended for the space of one year from the date of this Order.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His present Majesty's reign, intituled "An "abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that certain ports, therein particularly mentioned, in the island of Jamaica, and in the provinces of Nova Scotia, Canada, and New Brunswick, and in the island of Barbadoes, shall be free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act; and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Conncil, from time to time, to appoint any port in His Majesty's possessions in America to be a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act; and that every such port, so appointed by His Majesty, shall be a free warehousing port under the said Act, as if appointed by the same, in as full and ample a manner in all respects as any of the ports thereinbefore mentioned are free warehousing ports appointed by the said Act:

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient, that the port of Saint John's, in the island of Newfoundland, should be appointed a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers in him vested in and by the said Act of Parliament, order and appoint, that the said port of Saint John's, in the island of Newfoundland, shall be a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His, Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Sir George Murray, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

and third clauses of the said Act, "that if any " Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be en-" titled to receive any sum of money for or on ac-" count of his half-pay, shall be desirous of draw-"ing a bill of exchange for the same upon the "Commissioners of His Majesty's Navy, instead of receiving the same by remittance bill, he shall signify such desire, by letter, to the Treasure of His Majesty's Navy; and that if any " Officer in His Majesty's Navy, who shall be en-"titled to receive any sum of money for or on ac-"count of half-pay, shall be desirous of having his half-pay paid to him by extract at any of His Majesty's Dock-Yards where Clerks for thepayment of wages for the Navy shall reside, in-" stead of receiving the same by remittance bill or "bill of exchange, he is to apply either to the proper Clerk, at the Navy Pay-Office, in Lon-"don, or at the Pay-Office at such Dock-Yard, "signifying such his desire;" notice is hereby further given, that the half-pay ending the 30th of September last, will commence paying on the 19th October; and all persons desirous of drawing for or of having their half-pay remitted to them, may apply as above directed.
