PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

I T is this day ordered by His Majesty in Council, that the Parliament be prorogued, from Thursday the fifteenth day of this instant October, to Thursday the tenth day of December next.

Whitehall, September 30, 1829.

The King has been pleased to grant unto Robert Browne, of Fulwood-hall, in the county palatine of Lancaster, and of Courtaile, in the county of Wexford, in Ireland, Esq. Lieutenant-General in the Army, and Lieutenant-Colonel of the 12th (or the Prince of Wales's) Royal Regiment of Lancers, and unto Henrietta his wife, only daughter and heir of Sir Richard Clayton, late of Adlington, in the aforesaid county palatine, Bart. deceased, His royal licence and authority, that they may, in compliance with the earnest desire of Sir Robert Clayton, now of Adlington, Bart. (the uncle of the said Henrietta), take and use the surname of Clayton, in addition to and after that of Browne; that the said Robert Browne may also bear the arms of Clayton, quarterly with those of Browne; and that such surnames and arms may in like manner be borne and used by the issue of their marriage; the said arms being first duly exemplified according to the laws of arms, and recorded in the Heralds' Office, otherwise His Majesty's said licence and permission to be void and of none effect:

And also to command, that the said royal concession and declaration be registered in His Majesty's College of Arms. OTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made in the next session of Parliament, for leave to bring in a Bill for taking down the old market, commonly called or known by the name of Hungerford-market, in the parish of St. Martin in the Fields, in the county of Middlesex; and for erecting a new and more commodious market on the site thereof or near thereto; and for enlarging the same, by taking down certain houses and buildings adjoining or near to the present market; and for increasing and regulating the existing tolls and duties now payable on goods, wares, and merchandises brought into the said market, or landed upon the quays adjacent thereto; and also for explaining and amending several Acts of Parliament, passed in the reigns of King George the Second and King George the Third, respecting free markets in the city of Westminster for the sale of fish.
