Saint James, Westminster.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for leave to bring in a Bill or Bills to explain, amend, repeal, alter, or consolidate the several Acts of Parliament following, that is to say, an Act, passed in the first year of the reign of His late Majesty King James the Second, intituled "An Act for erecting a new parish, to be called the parish of Saint James, within the liberty of Westminster;" also an Act, passed in the twentieth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Second, intituled "An Act to confirm an agreement made by the Rector and Vestrymen of the parish of Saint James, within the liberty of Westminster, for enlarging the church-yard of the said parish, and for other purposes therein mentioned;" also an Act, passed in the second year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act for the better relief and employment of the poor, and for cleansing the streets, lanes, and other passages and places, in the parish of Saint James, within the liberty of Westminster, and for enlarging the church-yard belonging to the said parish;" and also an Act, passed in the fifty-sixth year of the reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to amend an Act, of the second year of His present Majesty, for the better relief and employment of the poor of the parish of Saint James, within the liberty of Westminster; and another Act, of the first year of King James the Second, for erecting the said parish." And in which said Bill or Bills provisions are intended to be made for increasing the number of Vestrymen of the said parish of Saint James, Westminster; also for regulating the election or appointment, and continuance in office, of the Vestrymen of the said parish; also for regulating the election or appointment, and continuance in office, of Governors and Directors of the poor of the said parish; also for the better conducting the

proceedings of the Vestry, and of the Governors and Directors of the poor of the said parish; also for altering or repealing the existing rates, or making such other rates as may be deemed necessary for raising money for the repairs of the church, and for the relief of the poor, and for such other purposes as are authorised by the aforesaid Acts, or any or either of them; also for securing the due application of the pew rents, and of all monies authorised to be raised or which may be receivable for the purposes aforesaid; also for keeping the accounts of the Churchwardens, and of the Vestry and Governors and Directors of the poor of the said parish respectively; and also for electing or appointing Auditors of such accounts.

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing session, for an Act to increase the fund for carrying into execution an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for improving the approaches to London-bridge, by applying all or part of the duties, revenues, and incomes, composing the fund called the Orphans' Fund (from and after the period when the present charges on that fund shall be paid and satisfied), to the fund for effecting the said approaches, and for that purpose to continue the said duties, revenues, and incomes, for a limited time after such duties would otherwise expire; also to apply to the said fund one moiety of the clear profits which may arise from the tolls and duties of Fleet-market, belonging to the Mayor and Commonalty and Citizens of the City of London; also to apply to the said fund the surplus of the rents and profits of the estates called the Bridge-house estates, which may from time to time arise after paying and satisfying the charges on those estates; and it is also intended to take power to raise a sum of money upon
