PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," the several sorts of goods enumerated or described in a certain table therein contained, denominated "a Table of Prohibitions and Restrictions," are either prohibited to be imported or brought, either by sea or by inland carriage or navigation, into the British possessions in America, or into the Island of Mauritius, or are permitted to be imported or brought into those possessions under the restrictions made in such table; and in and by the said Act provision is made respecting the manner in which vessels and goods shall be entered and cleared inwards and outwards in the British possessions in America, and in the said Island of Mauritius; and for the prevention of smuggling in the said British possessions in America, and in the said Island of Mauritius: and whereas by an Act, passed in the seventh year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to alter and amend the several laws relating to the Customs;" and by an Act, passed in the seventh and eighth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs;" and by an Act, passed in the ninth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs;" and by an Act, passed in the tenth year of His Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend the laws relating to the Customs;" the before-mentioned provisions of the Act, so passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign, have been altered and amended: and whereas by the said Act, so passed in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign, it is, amongst other things,

enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, by any Order or Orders in Council to be issued from time to time, to give such directions and make such regulations, touching the trade and commerce to and from any British possessions on or near the Continent of Europe, or within the Mediterranean Sea, or in Africa, or within the limits of the East India Company's charter (excepting the possessions of the said Company), as to His Majesty in Council shall appear most expedient and salutary; and that if any goods shall be imported or exported in any manner contrary to any such Order of His Majesty in Council, the same shall be forfeited, together with the ship importing or exporting the same; His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested as aforesaid in Him in and by the said Act, so passed as aforesaid in the sixth year of His reign, order, and it is hereby ordered, that so much of the said Act, so passed as aforesaid in the sixth year of His Majesty's reign; and so much of the said several Acts of Parliament, so passed as aforesaid in the seventh, and in the seventh and eighth, and in the ninth, and in the tenth years of His Majesty's reign, as impose prohibitions and restrictions on the importation of goods into the British possessions in America, and the Island of Mauritius; and as relate to the entry of vessels and goods inwards and outwards in those possessions and the Island aforesaid; and to the prevention of smuggling there; shall be, and the same are hereby, extended and made applicable to His Majesty's settlements at Sierra Leone, and all other His Majesty's settlements on the Western Coast of Africa:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, about half past seven o'clock on the evening of Thursday the 12th day of November instant, Robert Harrison and Pattison, game-keepers in the employ of the Right Honourable the Earl of Lonsdale, were keeping watch in a wood adjoining the village of Melkingshorpe, in the parish of Lowther, in the county of Westmoreland, when they discovered four armed poachers, whom they pursued and had nearly overtaken, when one of the said poachers turned round and fired at and severely wounded the said Robert Harrison, who was unarmed, and is now in a dangerous and uncertain state;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually fired at and wounded the said Robert Harrison) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

THE following is a copy of an Order in Council, approving of a district being assigned to the new chapel built at Sharow, in the parish of Ripon:

At the Court at St. James's, the 10th of June 1829, present, the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," it is amongst other things enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act, shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more separate and distinct parishes for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the Bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his consent to make such division, and for such

patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto under his hand and seal, and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe lands, tithes, moduses, or other endowments, which will by such division arise and accrue and remain and be within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions, and if thereupon His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and whereas by the said Act it is further enacted "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete separate and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts, as they with the consent of the Bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary, for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending Divine Service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches or parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendance of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein; the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if thereupon His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such division to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division:" and whereas by an Act passed in the 59th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act passed in the last session of Parliament, for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," further provisions are made for carrying such division into effect: and whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that the parish of Ripon, in the county and diocese of York, contained in the year 1821, when the last census was taken, a population of 13,096 persons, and which has since considerably increased; that besides the parish church, there were seven consecrated chapels, which together afforded accommodation for 1580 persons only; that a new chapel

has lately been erected at Sharow, in that parish, by subscription, and a grant from the Society for promoting the building and enlarging of churches and chapels, wherein accommodation has been provided for 550 persons, including 280 free sittings appropriated to the use of the poor; that such chapel has been consecrated, and divine service is regularly performed therein; that it appears to the said Commissioners to be expedient, for securing a due ecclesiastical superintendance of the parish, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein, that an ecclesiastical district should be assigned to the new chapel, under the provisions of the 16th section of the Act of the 59th year of His late Majesty's reign, and that such district should be named, Sharow District, with boundaries as follows:—The boundary to commence at the bridge over the River Ure, called the North Bridge, from thence to proceed northwards along the boundary of the township of Sharo', until it joins the township of Hutton Conyers; then to continue eastward along the boundary of the township of Hutton Conyers, till it joins the township of Nunwick; then along the said River Ure westerly, till it joins the parish of Wath; then crossing the said River Ure southward, along the boundary of the said township of Nunwick, till it joins the township of Hutton Conyers; then eastward along the boundary of Hutton Conyers, till it joins the parish of Topliff; then southward along the boundary of the township of Hutton Conyers, till it joins the township of Copt Hewick with Bridge Hewick; then southward and westward along the township of Copt Hewick with Bridge Hewick, till it joins the boundary of the township of Givendale; then crossing the said River Ure westward, along the boundary of the township of Givendale, till it joins the township of Littlethorpe; then northwards along the boundary of the township of Copt Hewick with Bridge Hewick, till it joins the boundary of the township of Sharo'; then northwards along the boundary of the township of Sharo' to the said bridge called the North Bridge; which district is described in the accompanying plan: that the consent of the Lord Bishop of the diocese has been obtained as required by the provisions of the Act of Parliament; and humbly praying, that His Majesty would be pleased to take the premises into consideration, and to make such order in respect thereto as to His Majesty should seem meet:—His Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed division be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Acts.

THE following is a copy of an Order in Council, approving of parts of the parishes of Kenton and Dawlish being assigned to the new chapel built at Starcross as a district:

At the Court at Windsor, the 24th of Novem-

ber 1828, present, the King's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act for building and promoting the building of additional churches in populous parishes," it is amongst other things enacted, "that in every case in which the Commissioners appointed for carrying into execution the purposes of the said Act, shall be of opinion that it will be expedient to divide any parish into two or more distinct and separate parishes, for all ecclesiastical purposes whatever, it shall be lawful for the said Commissioners, with the consent of the Bishop of the diocese in which such parish is locally situated, signified under his hand and seal, to apply to the patron or patrons of the church of such parish for his or their consent to make such divisions, and for such patron or patrons to signify his or their consent thereto, under his or their hand and seal, and the said Commissioners shall, upon the consent of the said patron or patrons so signified, represent the whole matter to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which it is proposed, with such consent as aforesaid, to divide such parish, together with the relative and respective proportions of glebe lands, tithes, moduses, or other endowments, which will by such division arise and accrue and remain and be within each of such respective divisions, and also the relative proportions of the estimated amount of the value or produce of fees, oblations, offerings, or other ecclesiastical dues or profits, which may arise and accrue within each of such respective divisions; and if thereupon His Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such divisions to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division; provided always, that no such division of any parish into distinct parishes shall completely take effect until after the death, resignation, or other avoidance of the existing incumbent of the parish to be divided;" and whereas by the said Act it is further enacted, "that in any case in which the said Commissioners shall be of opinion that it is not expedient to divide any populous parish, or extra parochial place, into such complete separate and distinct parishes as aforesaid, but that it is expedient to divide the same into such ecclesiastical districts as they, with the consent of the Bishop, signified under his hand and seal, may deem necessary, for the purpose of affording accommodation for the attending divine service, according to the rites of the United Church of England and Ireland, to persons residing therein, in the churches and parochial chapels already built, or in additional churches or chapels to be built therein, and as may appear to such Commissioners to be convenient for the enabling the spiritual person or persons who may serve such churches or chapels to perform all ecclesiastical duties within the districts attached to such respective churches and chapels, and for the due ecclesiastical superintendance of such district, and the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing therein; the said Commissioners shall represent such opinion to His Majesty in Council, and shall state in such representation the bounds by which such districts are proposed to be described; and if, thereupon, His

Majesty in Council shall think fit to direct such divisions to be made, such Order of His Majesty in Council shall be valid and good in law for the purpose of effecting such division;" and whereas by an Act, passed in the 59th year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to amend and render more effectual an Act, passed in the last session of Parliament, for building, and promoting the building, of additional churches in populous parishes," further provisions are made for carrying such divisions into effect: and whereas the said Commissioners have made a representation to His Majesty in Council, stating that the parish of Kenton, in the county of Devon and diocese of Exeter, contained in the year 1821, when the last census was taken, a population of 1890 persons, and the parish of Dawlish, in the same county and diocese, a population of 2700 persons, that the population of the said parishes has since considerably increased; that the accommodation in the parish church of Kenton extends to 700 persons only, and in the parish church of Dawlish to 600 persons, which are the only consecrated places of worship in those parishes; that the said Commissioners have caused a new chapel to be erected in the village of Starcross, capable of accommodating 600 persons, viz. 350 persons in pews, and the remainder in free sittings for the use of the poor; and that the same has been consecrated, and divine service is regularly performed therein; that such village is situate in the confines of the parishes of Kenton and Dawlish, and distant from the parish church of the former about a mile and a half, and from that of the latter about three miles; and that such village, with its immediate neighbourhood, contains a population of upwards of 1200 persons; that it appears to the said Commissioners to be expedient, for securing a due ecclesiastical superintendance of the parish, and for the preservation and improvement of the religious and moral habits of the persons residing in the neighbourhood of such new chapel, that part of the parishes of Kenton and Dawlish should be assigned to the new chapel as a district, under the provisions of the aforesaid Acts; and that the boundaries of the said district should be as follows: the boundary line to commence due north at the Lower Marsh-gate, situated on the road leading from the village of Starcross, in the parish of Kenton, to Powderham Church, and proceeding from thence in a south westerly direction to Wetcombe Cross Roads; thence south west on Black Ditch Cross, and proceeding south west by west to the road leading from Cofford to Mowlish, all which said places are in the parish of Kenton; thence from the road leading from Cofton, in the parish of Dawlish, to the parish of Mainhead, and continuing to the southward, and bounding on Lane End, in the parish of Dawlish; and from thence to the southward, and adjoining the Cliff on the sea shore, in the parish of Kenton, and along the sea side to the south east, and to Langstone Point, in the parish of Kenton; and from thence proceeding to the north, and to the Salt Works, in the parish of Kenton, and including the Rabbit Warrens, situate north easterly or northerly from Langstone Point, and to Cockwood, in the parish of Dawlish; and from thence to the north, and to the village of Starcross, and along the bank of the Exe River to Lower Marsh-gate, from which the boundary commenced;

all which is more particularly described in the map hereunto annexed: that the consent of the Lord Bishop of the diocese has been obtained, as required by the hereinbefore in part, recited Act, passed in the 58th year of His late Majesty's reign; and humbly praying, that His Majesty would be pleased to take the said circumstances into consideration, and to make such order therein as to His Majesty should seem meet:—His Majesty having taken the said representation into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve thereof, and to order, as it is hereby ordered, that the proposed division be accordingly made and effected, agreeably to the provisions of the said Act.
