that the Parliament be prorogued, from Thursday
the tenth day of this instant *December*, to Thurs-
day the fourth day of *February* next.

A PROCLAMATION.

GEORGE, R.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued
to Thursday the tenth day of this instant *Decem-
ber*; We, with the advice of our Privy Council,
do hereby publish and declare, that the said Par-
liament shall be further prorogued, on the said
tenth day of this instant *December*, to Thurs-
day the fourth day of *February* next; and We have
given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our
United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a
commission for proroguing the same accordingly;
and We do further hereby, with the advice afore-
said, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the
said Parliament shall, on the said fourth day of
February next, assemble and be held for the dis-
patch of divers urgent and important affairs: And
the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights,
Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for
Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons,
are hereby required and commanded to give their
attendance accordingly, at *Westminster*, on the said
fourth day of *February* next.

Given at Our Court at *Windsor*, this seventh

day of *December*, one thousand eight hun-
dred and twenty-nine, and in the tenth year
of Our reign.
