THE King has been pleased to appoint the Right Honourable James Abercromby to be Chief Baron of His Majesty's Court of Exchequer in Scotland, vacant by the resignation of Sir Samuel Shepherd.

The King has also been pleased to grant to the Reverend James Somers Cocks, M. A. the place and dignity of a Canon or Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Worcester, void by the death of Doctor Sir Herbert Oakeley, Bart.
