An Act to apply certain sums of money out of the Consolidated Fund, and from the aids granted for the year one thousand eight hundred and twentynine, to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty.

An Act to authorise the transfer of certain balances in the hands of the Clerks of the Peace of the several counties of England and Wales, on account of lunatic asyloms licences.
