THE following Address of the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland, having been transmitted by James O'honcar Lord Forbes, His Majesty's Commissioner, to the Right Honourable Sir Robert Peel, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, has been by him presented to the King; which Address His Majesty was pleased to receive very graciously:

May it please your Majesty,

YOUR Majesty's gracious Letter to this General Assembly of the Church of Scotland has been received by us with the highest respect and gratitude.

The expression of your Majesty's approbation of

the manner in which we have hitherto discharged the important trust reposed in us, and the renewed assurance of your unalterable resolution to maintain the establishment which we represent in the full and free enjoyment of all its rights and privileges, cannot fail to animate us with an increasing desire to prove ourselves deserving of the protection and countenance which it has long been our happiness to enjoy.

The re-appointment of Lord Forbes, as the representative of your Royal Person, is hailed by this Assembly as an additional proof of your Majesty's paternal regard; and it is most satisfactory to us to know that a Nobleman, endeared to this Church by the urbanity and purity of his manners, has equally approved himself to our beloved Sovereign, by his upright and faithful execution of the important trust with which he has been repeatedly invested.

Feeling most strongly the value of the counsels which your Majesty has been pleased to convey to us, we will endeavour, through the aid of divine grace, to devote ourselves earnestly to those services which we are condescendingly assured have been so highly acceptable to your Majesty, on account of their tendency to promote the happiness of your people; and in aiming at this great object, than which nothing can be nearer your Majesty's heart, we will not fail to keep in view the indissoluble connexion subsisting between the temporal prosperity of the people and their firm adherence to the principles of religion and virtue; a consideration which, in proportion as it dignifies our duty, calls upon us at the same time for the most zealous and faithful discharge of it.

We thankfully acknowledge, and engage faithfully to apply, your Majesty's liberal donation of two thousand pounds, for propogating Christian knowledge in the Highlands and Islands of Scotland.

We cordially unite with your Majesty in praying, that this Meeting may be brought to a happy conclusion under the guidance and protection of Divine Providence, supplying us richly with that wisdom and discretion, which your Majesty is pleased to say have been at all times so eminently displayed by the Assemblies of this Church.

That the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ may bless your Majesty with all spiritual blessings, and make your glory great in his salvation; that he may sustain and refresh your spirit amidst the cares of government and the vicissitudes of this transitory life; that he may fulfil the desires of an affectionate people, by the speedy and complete re-establishment of your health; and that, after being satisfied with length of days and abundance of peace, and the universal diffusion of that righteousness which exalteth a nation, an entrance may be ministered to you abundantly into the everlasting kingdom of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, is the earnest prayer of, may it please your Majesty, your Majesty's most faithful, most loyal, and most obedient subjects, the Ministers and Elders of this General Assembly of the Church of Scotland.
