And His Majesty being resolved to put down such diabolical attempts, and to bring the offenders to condign punishment, a reward of TWO HUNDRED POUNDS is hereby offered to any person (except as aforesaid) who shall discover the said offender or offenders, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said offence.—Such reward to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury.
