Janifaries and 4000 of the Inhabitan's, being conducted several Miles by an Imperial Convoy, in their way to Buda. The Imperialists found in Gran 18 pieces of Cannon, 400000 l. of Powder, and good store of Provisions, and made themselves Masters of this important place, which had been 78 years in the Power of the Turks, with the loss only of 150 men. We have advice that the Groats, with the Troops of Stiria, and thuse of Bunzary that are faithful to the Emperor, do block up Canifa. And that the Grand Visier continues to recire towards Belgrade, abandoning Hungary to the Arms of the Christians.

Copenhagen, Ottober 19. The King of Denmark, who is returned from Holstein, intends to go in a few days to Fredericksburg to Hunt. The Cou t de Guldenlieu is arrived from Norway. Our Fleet lyes before this place, except some of the greatest Ships which are come into the Harbour. We are expecting book the two Frigats that were sent to Pilot the French Fleet through the Categot. The 14th the King took a review of his stoops tha are here, the Count de Reye Mareschal de Camp General being present thereat.

Hamburg, Odober 25. The Letters from Post dam, where the Elector of Brandenburg at present is, of the 18th instanties us, that they were making Preparations for the R ception of the Elector of Jaxony, who was exp ched there in a day or two. From Dantzieke they write, that the Count de Morstein, late great Treasurer of Poland, was still there; and that the Magistre tes of that City had, according to the directions they had received from the King of Poland, scaled up the Warehouse that had been hired for the use of the said Count, and where it's said he had lodged his Goods which he

purposed to carry with him to France.

Cologne, November 5. From Liniz we have an account by Letters of the 30th instant, of the taking of Gran by the Imperial Army, commanded by the Elector of Bavaria and the Duke of Lorrain; and that the King of Poland was gone to possels himself of several small places in upper Hungary: The Troops of the Empire, especially the Horie, are, it's said, coming back, and will have their Win-

ter Quarters on the Rbine.

Bruffels, November 9. We have an account from Flanders, that the Citta el of Courtray was furrendred to the French on Sunday last, the Garison marched out with Bag and Baggage, Drums beating, Colours flying, and with four pieces of Cannon, and went to Gaunt: There were at Coursray about 30 French Deserters, who being excepted in the Capitulation, were taken and executed the next day: The French, as it's faid, are once marched towards Audenarde. From Lille they write, that the French Intendants have received orders from Court, to Sequester the Rents of the Estates which the Subjects of Spain have within the French Ter-ritories. The Winter Quarters for the Dutch Troops are feeled, four Regiments of Foot and hree of Horse are to be here with Monsieur Aylva and Monsieur Slangenberg, three of Foot and as many of Horse are to Winter with Monsieur Ginckle and Monsicur Scravamoer at Malines, Monfleur d'Auvergne will remain with two Regiments of Foot at Gaunt; and the rest will be put into Vilvord, Dendermond, Diest, and Herenstals. We are told that the Emperor will fend feveral Troops hither in the Spring; and that the Marquis de Grana expects a confiderable Body of Swedes, which it's said the Dutch Fleet is to bring from Gottenburg. Yesterday his Excellency received, by Letters from Lintz, the good news of the taking of Grun by the mperial Acmy, for which Te Deum has been fung

here, and the Cannon round the Town thrice difcharged.

Paris, November 10. A Courier that arrived here yesterday from Germany, brought the news that the Christians had taken Gran, and that they were marching to block up, if not to befiege Newbeus. It; and that the King of Poland being reinforced with 10000 Lithuanians, was gone to possess himself of several places in the upper Hungary, thereby to secure their Winter quarters. From Flanders we have an account that the Town and Cittadel of Courtray were surrendred to the French, the first on Thursday, and the latter on Sunday last, the Marquis de Wargnies the Governor, marching with his Garison to Gaunt.

Westminster, November 7. This day Algernon Sidney Ely; was brought by Habeas Corpus from the Tower to the Kings Bench Bar, where he was Arraigned upon an Indicament of High Treafon, in Conspiring the Death of the King, and to Levy War against His Majesty; to which he pleaded Not Guilty, and desiring a Fortnights time for his Tryal, the Court granted the same, and appointed his Tryal to be on this day Fortnight, and

then he was remanded to the Tower.
