

Whitehall, December 3, 1830.

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, early on the morning of Saturday the 27th day of November last, some evil-disposed person or persons did feloniously and maliciously put a case containing combustible materials into the letter-box of the Post Office at Derby, by the explosion of which, considerable damage was occasioned;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually put the said case into the said letter-box) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.

And, as a further encouragement, a reward of **ONE HUNDRED POUNDS** is hereby offered to any person (except as aforesaid) who shall discover the said offender or offenders, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted of the said offence.—Such reward to be paid by the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury. **MELBOURNE.**

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, about six o'clock in the evening of Sunday the 28th day of November last, a barn in the occupation of Mr. Hodgson, Butcher, near Swalwell-bridge, in the parish of Ryton, in the county of Durham, was feloniously and maliciously set on fire by some evil-disposed person or persons unknown;

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person who actually set fire to the said barn) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. **MELBOURNE.**

WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, on the morning of Monday the 6th day of December instant, about two o'clock, the dwelling-house of Miss Clarke, at Ashby Puerorum, near Horncastle, in the county of Lincoln, was forcibly entered through an upper window by three men, armed with pistols, who broke open the door of Miss Clarke's sleeping-room, and with intimidating threats, demanded and obtained from her all the money in her possession;

bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof. **MELBOURNE.**
