WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, on the evening of Thursday the 23d day of December instant, ten persons, armed with guns and other weapons, entered a wood belonging to Sir Thomas Hare, Bart. in the parish of Stow, in the county of Norfolk, for the destruction of game, and that upon the gamekeepers repairing to the spot with such assistance as they could collect, two guns were discharged by the said persons at James Weston, a constable of Downham, from the effects of which he died in a short time;

His Majesty for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the felony before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the persons who fired the said guns) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
