WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that certain ports, therein particularly mentioned, in the island of *Jamaica*, and in the provinces of *Nova Scotia*, *Canada*, and *New Brunswick*, and in the island of *Barbadoes*, shall be free warehousing ports for the purposes of the said Act; and it is further enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council, from time to time, to
