

North Queen's-ferry and Lord Elgin's Lime-kilns ; White Booth-roads, (between Hull and Grimsby) ; Standgate-creek ; the Motherbank, at Portsmouth ; Plymouth ; Falmouth ; Milford-haven ; Bromboro'-pool, (in the river Mersey, near Liverpool) ; Holy-loch, in the Frith of Clyde ; and shall there perform quarantine, and be subject with their crews, pilots, and all persons having communication with such vessels, to all the rules and regulations established by His late Majesty's Order in Council, of the nineteenth of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty-five :

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Commissioners for executing the office of Lord High Admiral of Great Britain, the Lord Warden of the Cinque Ports, the Master-General and the rest of the Principal Officers of the Ordnance, His Majesty's Secretary at War, and the Governors and Commanders in Chief for the time being of the said isles of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark and Man, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.
