E Your Majeflies moft Loyal and Dutiful subjects (not able to ex. prefs our deep Horror and Ajlonijhment from the juft and dreadful apprebenfoons nee bad of the Danger of Tour Majeffies Sacred Perfon, and Tour Royal Brotber, and thereby of our Lives and Fortunes, of the Peace, Liberty, and Profperity of thefe Your Majeffies Kingdoms, by the late Traiterous and moft Bloody and Barbarous ConfpiYitiof a frange Combination of men of Atbiffical Fanatical and Republican Principles and dijcontented Spiitits) mof bumbly prefume to prefent to Your Majeffy our toalate, yet moft Loyal Congratulations of that Your moft remarkable and miraculous Deliverance.

Viemna, November 28 . The laf Eetters from Hinn gary told us, that the King of poland was ffill at$E /$ peries, to give Vigor to the Negotiation that is on fuot with Count Teckpley, who, it's believed, will be at laft forced by the neceflity of his Affairs, to fubmit himfelf to the Emperor. His Forces are very much weakened by the Defertion of thofe who have thought itptime to provide for themfelves, and the Emperor having refufed to grant
hint the Winter－quarters，he defires，unlefs he whereupon the Spaniards pofted their Foot and abiolutely quit his Engagements with the Turks， the Troops he has left will be hardly able to fubfilt this Winter．It＇s hoped that the Commiffion which the Emperor has appointed at Presbourg， whereof the karon d＇Abele is chief，will have a happy effect for the eflablifhing the Aftairs of that Kingdom．

Lints；Noversber 3a．We are told that the Em－ peror has declared that the Hungarians fhall have the free exercife of their Religion，and that the Churches taken from them，and their confifated Elates，乌hall be reltored．The Baron d＇Abele，whom the Emperor has appointed his Commifioner for the regulatitg the affairs of that Kingdom，has Or－ ders to kaltento Presbourg，where he is to operi his Commiltion．The Emperor is not only fending Ambafladors to Mofcovy，fiom whence they write， that the Gzars are very much enclined to a War againlt the Turks；but bas likewife made choice of a Gentleman to go in quality of his En－ voy to the King of Pergoe，to acquaint him with the great and happy fucceffes of his Arms againft the Turks，and to reprefent to him the advantage he may make of this favourable conjundture， in cafe be attack the Turks on that fide．Com－ midious are prepating for 12 new Regiments；and Monqys are diftributed to the Officers to make cheir recruits，for which Service a confiderable Sum of Money has been remitted hither from Spain．

Ratisbonme，December 2．The Elector of Buvaria is returned to Munick，baving，before he parted from Lintz，impowered the Sieir Berkbeim to Sign on his behalf the I reaty of Alliance between the Emperor，Spain，Sweden，and the States Ge－ neralof the United Provinces．And it is faid that his Electoral Highners is refolved to encrcafe his Forces to 20000 men．They write from Lintz，that they were beginning their preparations againft the Spring，and that they hare advice from all hands that the Grand Vizier is endeavourieg to bring a very formidable Army into the Field the next year． The Emperor is fending an Ambaffador to Mofcavy， who is to be a Mediator between the Mofo－ vites and the Poles，for the determining the diffe－ rences that have fo long depended between them an boat their Limits，and to negotiate an Alliance be－ twsen his Imperial Majelly，the King of Poland，and the Czars，againft the Turks．The Counts de Dra－ knovitz and Budiazi did on the 19 th Inftant obtajn the Emperor＇s Pardon，with rellithtion of cheir con－ fircated Eftates．

Brafels，Debemb，7．Two Dutch Regiments of Foor，who are now bere，have Orders to march to Cbarleyoy，whither the Marquis de Grana intends to fend at the fame time a great Convoy，that that Ga－ rifon may be provided with all things neceffary for their fabifitence and defence：The place is at pres fent in a manner blocked up，Monficur da Montalha－ ving poffeficd himfelf of reveral Polts round it． The French Veffels that were ftopt at Gaunt are difcharged，his Excellency declaring he will not give any diflurbance to Commerce Our Letters from Germany tell us，That the Elector of bavaria is en－ tred into the Treaty of Guaranty concluded fome time lince at the Hague．

Bru／fels，Decrmb．Io Two Regiments that were in Garifon here are marched to Bruges，the people there being in great fear of the French．There happen very frequent Rencounters brtween the Spanifh and French Parties．From Lixxemburg we have an account，That a Party of 350 Horfe and Dragoons， and 200 Foot of that Garifon，under the Command of the Baron de Cbauvelier，having been towards Thionville，nind．returning on the firft Inftant with a great Booty of Horfes and Cattle，they had no－ tice that a party of French Horfe followed them；

Dragoons in a covered way，and made hhẹw of retiring with their Horle：The French fell into the Ambuicade，and 80 of them were killed and wound－ ed ufon the place；and the Spanifh Horfe turn－ ing upon them，purfued them three quarters of a League ；but fome French Squadrons of Hurde and Dragoons from Thionville coming oprortuncly to relieve their Party，the Spaniards retreated，having fecured their Beoty，and brought off 34 Prifoncrs， （among which were feveral Officers ）and 60 Hor－ fes；but being very hard preffed upon by the French， they were obliged to leave their Foot，of whom feveral were kilied，and 60 taken Prifoners．The French，to prevent the like Incurions，intend to block up Luxemburg，and for that purpoic have put Garifons into Etternach and Gravemakeren，and have fortified all the Palfes upon the River．The French having underftood that the Veffels fopt at Gauxt were difcharged，have likewife relealed thofe that were arrefted at Condé and Tournay．

Bruffels，Degemb．14．Our Spanifh Letters give us an account，That War hath beeh Declared at Madrid againft France，and a like Declaration is in the Prefs to be publifhed here．
Paris，December iI．A great Squadron of Men of War is fitting out at Toulon，and other Preparations are making for a third Expedition againgt the algierines，and．Monfieur du Quefne continues at Thoulon to haiten them．The King has given orders for the raifing 300 Young Gentlemen，who are to be employed in the Service of his Fleet，and areto be di－ Itributed into three Companies，one at Breft，another at Rochefort，anda third ar Thoulon．There is a difourfat Court，that the King intends to take the next month a Jour－ nay to Compeigne，buc＇tis withour any certainty．We，ase rold that the Spanifh Ambalador did two or three days agone acquaine the Popes Nincio that he has orders to return home． The King，it＇s faid，is fending an Bnvoy to the King of Po－ land，but we do not bear that any body is yet named tor that employment．The Bithop of Strasbourg arrived here the gith inftant from Iiege，where his prefence hath had the good effeit to putan end to the Differences that have folong di－ Hurbed the Peace of that City．From Flanders they write that Monfieur de Montal has put four Batallions，and feveral Squadrons of Horde into Thuin，a place not far from thates and that he is forcifying it，and that he has poffefled himiets of feveral other places and Caftles in that Neighborboad， and berween the sambre and the Meqfe．
London，Decemb．7．This day Algernon Sidney．Efq； was brought from the Tower to the place appointed for his Execution on Tower－Hill，where he was Behcaded on a Scaffold erected for that purpofe．
