The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the sixth year of His late Majesty's reign, intituled "An Act to regulate the trade of the British possessions abroad," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that no goods shall be imported into, nor shall any goods, except the produce of the fisheries in British ships, be exported from any of the British possessions in America by sea, or from or to any place other than the United Kingdom, except into or from the several ports in such possessions called free ports, enumerated or described in the table in the said Act of Parliament contained:

And it is thereby provided, that if His Majesty shall deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to any port or place not enumerated in the said table, it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to extend the provisions of the said Act to such port or ports, and it is enacted, that from and after the day mentioned in such Order in Council, all the privileges and advantages of the said Act, and all the provisions, penalties, and forfeitures therein contained, shall extend, and be deemed and construed to extend, to any such port or ports respectively, as fully as if the same had been inserted and enumerated in the said table at the time of passing the said Act:

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient to extend the provisions of the said Act to the ports of Black River, Rio Bueno, and Morant, in the island of Jamaica; His Majesty doth therefore, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the said Act of Parliament, and with the advice of His Privy Council, order, and it is hereby ordered, that, from and after the date of this Order, the provisions of the said Act of Parliament respecting free ports shall be, and the same are hereby, extended to the said ports of Black River, Rio Bueno, and Morant, in the island of Jamaica:

And the Right Honourable the Lord Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Viscount Goderich, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

And whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient, that the port of Basseterre, in the island of Saint Christopher, should be appointed a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act, His Majesty doth therefore, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers in him vested, in and by the said Act of Parliament, order and appoint, that the said port of Basseterre, in the island of Saint Chsistopher, shall be a free warehousing port for the purposes of the said Act:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Viscount Goderich, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

THE Commissioners of the Northern Lighthouses hereby give notice, that a Light-house has been erected upon Dunnethead, in the county

of Caithness; the light of which will be exhibited on Saturday the 1st day of October next, and will thereafter continue to be lighted every night, from the going away of day-light in the evening till the return of day-light in the morning.

The following is a Specification of the Position of the Light-House, and the Appearance of the Light, by Mr. Stevenson, Engineer to the Commissioners:

Dunnethead Light-house is situate on the northern extremity of the mainland of Scotland, in north latitude 58 deg. 42 min., and west longitude 3 deg. 29 min.

The light-house, by compass; bears from the north end of the island of Stroma, in Pentland Frith, W. by N. distant $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles; from Hoy Head, leading to Hoy Sound, S. S. W. distant 13 miles; from the Stack and Skerry, S. by E. $\frac{3}{4}$ E. distant 31 miles; and from Cape Wrath, in Sutherlandshire, E. by S. $\frac{3}{4}$ S. distant 42 miles. In reference to these bearings, the light will be visible to the mariner in a northerly direction from S. E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. to W.

This light will be known to mariners as a stationary light, from oil, with reflectors; and being elevated 346 feet above the medium level of the sea, it will be seen like a star of the first magnitude, at the distance of from 7 to 8 leagues, and at intermediate distances, according to the state of the weather.
