Bruftels, Decemb. 1 T. This day was publifhed here a Declaration of War againft France ; by which all Generals, Governors, Commanders in Chief, and o: her Military Officers and Suldiers, and all other Officersand Subjects of his Catholick Majeffy, are commanded to attack and fall upou the Troops and Subjecls of France wherever they are, and to treat them as Enemies of his CatholickMajelty; and all Vaffals and Subjects of His Majelty, which are ar prefent in any place within the Dominion of France, are required to retire from thence within fifteen days after the Publication thereof, and not to hold any Correfpondence or Commerce with the Subjects of France ; and all Officers and Soldiers, being Subjects of his Catholick Majefty, who are in the Scrvice of France, or any other Foreign Prince, are to retyrn, within a Mc nth, under his Majefties Colours, on pain of Death and Confifcation of Gacds. And all the Goods Moveable and Immoveable, Rents, Reyenuef, Rights, Debts, and all Effects belonging to tho Subjects of France intherc Countries, 2re declared Conficated for the ufe of His Majefty. TAnd all the Subjects of France, being within thele Countries, are commanded to depart the fame", with their Wives, Children, and, Families, within cight days after Publication thereof on pain of $b$.ing made Prifoners of War $\boldsymbol{y}$ And if any of the Subjects of his Catholick Majesty fhall canceal in their Houfss or elfewhere any Subjeat of France, they fhall pay for the firf time 1009 fatacens, for the fecond $20 c 0$, and for the third fhall fuffer Confifation c? their Goods, and other Anbitrary Punthment according to the Exigency of the cafe. .
