St. James's-Palace, October 5, 1831.

THE following Addresses to the King, on the occasion of their Majesties' Coronation, were this day presented to His Majesty at the Levee, and graciously received:

To the KING's Most Excellent Majesty.

Most Gracious Sovereign,

WE, your Majesty's loyal and dutiful subjects, the Guildry Incorporation of the city of Perth, North Britain, beg to approach the Throne, with sentiments of loyalty and devotion, to congratulate your Majesty and your Royal Consort, on your Coronation, and the completion of that solemn contract between your Majesty and your people, required by the Constitution, whereby the reciprocal duties of both are defined and made manifest.

We presume, at the same time, to offer our heartfelt thanks to your Majesty, for the firmness and constancy hitherto displayed by you in the great cause of reform, and to express our confidence, that your Majesty, under the advice of your present popular Ministers, will, by a just, well timed, and manly exercise of the undoubted prerogative of the Crown, prevent the wishes of the Nation from being thwarted, in a measure in which the King and his people are so cordially united.

That your Majesty and your Royal Consort the Queen, may long be spared to reign in peace and happiness over a free, loyal, contented, and united people, is our sincere and ardent prayer.
