preparations for the next Campagne, and we are told that lo foon as thefe matters are fetled his Highnels will return to Hungary where Count Statemberg is to have the chief command in the montime. They write from thence that the King of Poland, who has with the Emperor's confent granted the Hungarians some few places for Winterquarrers, intended to part from Esperies on the teth of this month on his return to Cracow, where it's still said his Majesty intends to hold a Dyet. This day parted from hence, the Coune de Berka, the Emperor's Envoy Extraordinary to the Kings of Denmark and Sweden. The Ambassadors which his Imperial Majesty is sending to Moscovy, will begia their journey in few days. The Emperor having presently after the railing the siege of Vienna made Count Staremberg Marcichal de Camp General, his Majesty has since given like Commissions to Count Lesie, Count Caprara, Count Caplieres, and the Duke of Saxe Lawenburg; the first is appointed to command the Emperor's Troops in Croatia; the second the Imperial Horse in Eungary; Count Caplieres, who is Vice-President of the Council of War, is by reason of his great age to remain at Court; and the Duke of Saxe Lawenburg is at present at his Estate in the Lower Saxony.

Francfort, December 10, The Elector of Bavaria arrived at Municken the 23. of the last month, making a publick Entry into that City. We are affured that his Electoral Highness has resolved to encrease his Forces to 20000 men, and that he has already given out Commissions for the making of new Levies. The Count de Serini, whom his Ele-Etoral Highness has made choice of to command his Porces, was expected at Municken in few days. From Lintz they write, that most of the Officers had received the moneys allowed them by the Emperor for the making their Recruits, but do not tell us with any certainty what new Regiments are to be raised. And that the Emperor was much dislatisfied that the Vice-Roy of Croatin had separated the Troops which blocked up Canifia, and pur them

into their Winter-quarters;

Dantzicke, December 5. We have Letters from Lemberg in Poland of the 19th of the last month, which inform us that the Sieur Krakowski had with the Troops under his Command, befieged faf-fwicke, which the Turks defended very well, and that the Bassa of Caminies had made an attempt to raise the Siege, having with part of his Garison and 2000 Tartars fallen upon the Poles, but was repulled and put to flight, many of the Turks and Tartars being killed and taken Prisoners. The king of Poland was expected at Cracow in his return from Hungary, part of his Baggage being al-

ready arrived there.

Hague, December 17. Upon the News of the War being declared at Madrid against France, the States of Holland were affembled on Tuesday last till eight a Clock at night, and have been fince every day affembled, but have not yet taken a final Resolution concerning the new Levy, which is the great matter before them. We are told that the Elector of Cologne's Minister has by a Memorial acquainted the States General that the Bilhop of Stratourg was gone for France upon no other defign, than to circleavour to obtain a Neutrality for the Country of Liege, and other his Electoral High, nesses Territories. The Heer Van Hairen, whom the States General have made choice of to go in quality of their Ambaffador Extraordinary to Smeden, will in few days receive his dispatches, and it's believed he will presently after begin his Journey, They write from Berlin that the Elector of Brandenburg railes men, intending, as they fay, to have threet, thall bave Twenty thillings teward a good Army in the Field the next Summer.

Marseilles; December 10. Yesterday arrived here a final Vessel from Newfoundland, the Masser whereof reports, that touching at Alicans, he found a
Bronch and Spanish Man of War engaged in that Bay, and that thollatter, after about half an hours fight, blew p, few or none of the men escaping, but by what accident, or any other particulars, he cannot inform us. The French Merchants Resident in Spain, 'do begin to retire with their Estates, finding a War is going to break out. Here has been a report these five or fix days, that Monsieur de Lery had taken the White Horse of Argiers, but it needs a Confimation. The fixth instant arrived here the Swan Frigat, Captain Habson Commander, from Tangier, and this Morning Sailed again for Genous and Legborne.

Paris, December 18. - The Spanish Ambassador at this Court being called home, has defired his Audiences of leave; and his most Christian Majefty's Ambassador in Spain is likewise on his return We have an account that the Elfates and hitber. Effects which the Subjects of this Crown have within the Spanish Dominions are Rized by order of his Carholick Majesty. The Sieur de la Croix is arrived at Thoulon with the Ratifications of the Peace which Monfieur du Quelne lately concluded with the Government of Tunes. The Duke de la Feuillade lies very ill, insomuch that his recovery is despaired of; It's faid the Duke of Filleroy will succeed him in the command of Colonel of the French Guards. The Pope's Nuncio here having received orders from Rome to cause the Jubile lately granted by the Pope to be published in this Kingdom; he haph accordingly fent the fame to all the Bishops of France, except the Archbishop of Thoulouse, who is lookt upon at Rome as Excommunicated. Several young Noblemen and other Perfons of Quality, are gone to join the Kings Troops, which it's faid are marching towards Luxemburg.

Paris, Decemb. 19. Last night the Dauphiness was, to the great joy of this Court, Brought, to-Bed of a young Prince, who is called Duke

d'Anjou.
