WHEREAS it hath been humbly represented unto the King, that, on the afternoon of Saturday the 5th day of November instant, the dead body of a boy (since discovered to be an Italian) was taken to the Dissecting-room of the King's College by four men, and there offered for sale to the Demonstrator of Anatomy, for the purpose of dissection; and that owing to the peculiar appearance of the body, together with other circumstances, inducing the belief that it had never been interred, but had been cruelly deprived of life for the above purpose, a Coroner's inquest was subsequently held upon the same, when the jury returned a verdict of "Wilful murder against some person or persons unknown;"
