## Whitehall, November 14, 1831.

THEREAS it hath been humbly represented with unto the King, that, on the afternoon of Saturday the 5th day of November instant, the dead body of a boy (since discovered to be an Italian) was taken to the Dissecting-room of the King's College by four men, and there offered for sale to the Demonstrator of Anatomy for the purpose of dissection; and that owing to the peculiar appearance of the body, together with other circumstances, inducing the belief that it had never been interred, but had been cruelly deprived of life for the above purpose, a Coroner's inquest was subsequently held upon the same, when the jury returned a verdict of "Wilful murder against some person or persons unknown;'

His Majesty, for the better apprehending and bringing to justice the persons concerned in the murder before mentioned, is hereby pleased to promise His most gracious pardon to any one of them (except the person or persons who actu-ally committed or assisted in the perpetration of the said murder) who shall discover his accomplice or accomplices therein, so that he, she, or they may be apprehended and convicted thereof.
