PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by an Act, passed in the second year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act to allow the importation of lumber, and of fish and provisions, duty free, into the islands of Barbadoes and St. Vincent, and to indemnify the Governors and others for having permitted the importation of those articles duty free," it is enacted, that from and after the passing of the said Act, lumber, and fish and provisions, shall and may be imported into the said islands respectively, duty free, until the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two; and it is thereby further enacted, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, by Order in Council, to continue in force the provisions of the said Act until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two; and whereas His Majesty doth deem it expedient to continue in force the provisions of the said Act, His Majesty doth, therefore, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in pursuance and exercise of the powers in him vested in and by the said Act of Parliament, order and direct that the provisions of the said Act shall be continued in force until the first day of March one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two:

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable Viscount Goderich, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain.

A PROCLAMATION.

WILLIAM, R.

WHEREAS certain of Our subjects, in different parts of Our Kingdom, have recently promulgated plans for voluntary associations, under the denomination of Political Unions, to be composed of separate bodies, with various divisions and subdivisions, under leaders with a gradation of ranks and authority, and distinguished by certain badges, and subject to the general controul and direction of a superior committee or council, for which associations no warrant has been given by Us, or by any appointed by Us on that behalf: and whereas, according to the plans so promulgated as aforesaid, a power appears to be assumed of acting independently of the Civil Magistrates, to whose requisition, calling upon them to be enrolled as constables, the individuals composing such associations are bound, in common with the rest of Our subjects, to yield obedience: and whereas such associations so constituted and appointed, under such separate direction and command, are obviously incompatible with the faithful performance of this duty, at variance with the acknowledged principles of the constitution, and subversive of the authority with which We are invested, as the Supreme Head of the State, for the protection of the public peace: and

whereas We are determined to maintain, against all encroachments on Our Royal power, those just prerogatives of the Crown, which have been given to Us for the preservation of the peace and order of society, and for the general advantage and security of Our loyal subjects: We have, therefore, thought it Our bounden duty, with and by the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, declaring all such associations, so constituted and appointed as aforesaid, to be unconstitutional and illegal, and earnestly warning and enjoining all Our subjects to abstain from entering into such unauthorised combinations, whereby they may draw upon themselves the penalties attending a violation of the laws, and the peace and security of Our dominions may be endangered.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS Our Parliament stands prorogued to Tuesday the twenty-second day of this instant November; We, with the advice of Our Privy Council, do hereby publish and declare, that the said Parliament shall be further prorogued, on the said twenty-second day of this instant November, to Tuesday the sixth day of December next; and We have given order to Our Chancellor of that part of Our United Kingdom called Great Britain, to prepare a commission for proroguing the same accordingly; and We do further hereby, with the advice aforesaid, declare Our Royal Will and Pleasure, that the said Parliament shall, on the said sixth day of December next, assemble and be held for the dispatch of divers urgent and important affairs: And the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and the Knights, Citizens, and Burgesses, and the Commissioners for Shires and Burghs of the House of Commons, are hereby required and commanded to give their attendance accordingly, at Westminster, on the said sixth day of December next.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament, made and passed in the sixth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled "An

" Act to repeal the several laws relating to the performance of Quarantine, and to make other provisions in lieu thereof, it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, to make such Order as they shall see necessary and expedient upon any unforeseen emergency, or in any particular case or cases with respect to any vessel arriving and having any infectious disease or distemper on board, or on board of which any infectious disease or distemper may have appeared in the course of the voyage, or arriving under any other alarming or suspicious circumstances as to infection, although such vessels shall not have come from any place from which His Majesty, his heirs or successors, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, may have adjudged and declared it probable that the plague, or any such infectious disease or distemper, may be brought; and also with respect to the persons, goods, wares, and merchandise, and other articles as aforesaid, on board the same; and in case of any infectious disease or distemper appearing or breaking out in the United Kingdom, or the islands of Guernsey, Jersey, Alderney, Sark, and Man, to make such orders and give such directions, in order to cut off all communication between any persons infected with any such disease or distemper and the rest of His Majesty's subjects, as shall appear to the said Lords, or others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, to be necessary and expedient for that purpose;" and whereas there hath appeared and broken out in the United Kingdom, an infectious disease or distemper, called the Spasmodic Cholera: and whereas in order to cut off all communication between persons infected with the said disease or distemper and the rest of His Majesty's subjects, the Lords and others of His Privy Council do deem it expedient, that all nuisances tending to promote such infection, should forthwith be abated and removed; it is, therefore, ordered by the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, in pursuance and exercise of the powers in them vested by the before recited Act of Parliament, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, that if it shall at any time be made to appear to any two or more of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace, on the certificate of any medical practitioner or practitioners, being a member or members of any board of health, constituted in pursuance of any Order of His Majesty's Privy Council, and on the oath of any one or more credible witness or witnesses, that there exists within the jurisdiction of such justices, any public nuisance injurious, or likely to become injurious, to the health of His Majesty's subjects, it shall be lawful for such justices, and they are hereby required and commanded to make an order, under their hands, addressed to the overseers or overseer, guardians or guardian, of the poor of any parish or extra-parochial place in which such nuisance shall be so proved to exist, requiring them or him to proceed forthwith to abate or remove such nuisance; and all overseers, and guardians of the poor to whom any such order shall be so addressed, are hereby required and enjoined, on the receipt by them, or any of them, of any such order, forthwith to proceed to the abatement or removal

of any such nuisance; and for that purpose to do, or cause to be done, all such acts as may be necessary and proper for that end; and all His Majesty's subjects are hereby required to be aiding and assisting to such overseers and guardians of the poor as aforesaid in the execution of any such order as may so be made by any such justices as aforesaid: and the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council do hereby declare, that for all acts, deeds, matters, and things which may be necessarily and properly done by any such justices of the peace, overseers, guardians of the poor, or other His Majesty's subjects, in execution and furtherance of this present Order, or of any order so to be made by any such justices as aforesaid, this Order shall be their full and sufficient warrant: and it is hereby further ordered, that this Order shall extend and apply to such places as shall, from time to time, be for that purpose directed by any Order to be made by any two or more of the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, such Order being certified to be a true Order, under the hand of one of the Clerks in Ordinary of the Privy Council.

"Lords, or others of His Majesty's Privy Council, or any two or more of them, to be necessary and expedient for that purpose:" and whereas the infectious disease or distemper called the Spasmodic Cholera hath appeared and broken out within the United Kingdom: and whereas, in order to cut off all communication between any persons infected with the said disease or distemper and the rest of His Majesty's subjects, it doth appear to the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council necessary and expedient that Boards of Health, to be constituted as hereinafter mentioned, should be established within such cities, towns, and other places within the United Kingdom as may be affected with, or as may be in danger of becoming affected with, the said disease, and that proper measures be taken for securing the communication to such medical boards of authentic intelligence respecting the actual state of the public health within any such city, town, or place, and the condition of all persons therein labouring under the said disease, or any other disease highly dangerous to the health of His Majesty's subjects:

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, in pursuance and exercise of the powers so vested in them as aforesaid, by the said Act of Parliament, and in pursuance of any other powers enabling them in that behalf, that Boards of Health shall forthwith be established in every city, town, or place within the United Kingdom, to which an order for that purpose shall be transmitted by the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council, such order being certified by the signature of one of the Clerks in Ordinary of the Privy Council; and that such Boards shall be constituted in such manner, and shall proceed in the execution of the duties committed to them in such form, and according to such regulations, as shall be directed and prescribed by any order so to be issued and certified as aforesaid: and it is further ordered, that every practitioner of medicine within every city, town, or place, in which every such Board shall be so constituted, shall and is hereby commanded and required to make to such Board a daily report, under his hand, containing a full, true, and particular account of the condition of every person attended by such medical practitioner who may be affected with the said disease, or with any other disease highly dangerous to the health of His Majesty's subjects; and all medical practitioners who shall neglect or omit to make any such return by the time, or at the place, or in the manner or form so to be required, or who shall in any such return wilfully make any false statement, are hereby warned and admonished that the several penalties consequent upon any such disobedience to the provisions of the before mentioned Act of Parliament will forthwith be enforced against them; and all mayors, magistrates, justices of the peace, and others, His Majesty's officers, civil and military, and subjects whomsoever, are hereby commanded to be aiding and assisting, to the utmost of their several abilities, in enforcing prompt obedience to this present Order, and in punishing by all lawful ways and means any neglect or violation thereof.

Whereas on the 19th July 1830, a Convention between His Britannic Majesty and the Government of the United Provinces of Rio de la Plata, was concluded and signed at Buenos Ayres, for the purpose of establishing a Commission to consider and decide upon all cases that shall be brought before it, properly authenticated, of the capture and seizure of British vessels, or detention of property belonging to the subjects of His Britannic Majesty, during the continuance of the war between that Republic and the Emperor of Brazil; the Commissioners appointed in pursuance of the said Convention hereby give notice that, under the power vested in them, they are ready to receive, hear, and determine, at their Office, in the Foreign-Office, Downing-street, all claims of the nature aforesaid; and all persons whom it may concern are hereby desired to observe the stipulation contained in the fourth article of the said Convention, whereby no claim will be admitted, which is not submitted to the Commission within six months after the present notice.
