It is particularly requested, that Gentlemen who are to be presented at the Levees will have their names *distinctly* written upon the card to be delivered to the Lord in Waiting, in order that there may be no mistake in announcing them to the King.

The state apartments will not be open for the reception of company coming to Court, until half past one o'clock.

named, to declare and notify the Royal Assent to the said Acts, was read accordingly, and the Royal Assent given to

An Act for raising the sum of twelve millions by Exchequer Bills, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

An Act for continuing to His Majesty, for one year, certain duties on personal estates, offices, and pensions in England, for the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

An Act to apply certain sums to the service of the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-two.

An Act for the prevention, as far as may be possible, of the disease called the cholera, or spasmodic or Indian cholera, in England.

An Act for the prevention, as far as may be possible, of the disease called the cholera, or spasmodic or Indian cholera, in Scotland.

An Act for the relief of His Majesty's subjects in Ireland, being Protestants of the Established Church, and to repeal an Act, passed in the Parliament of Ireland, in the thirty-third year of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled "An Act to remove some doubts respecting persons in office taking the sacramental test."

An Act to amend two Acts, passed in the fifty-eighth and fifty-ninth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the Third, for establishing fever hospitals, and for preventing contagious diseases, in Ireland.
