from the Tower to the Kings Bench, where his Lordships Councel very Fully and Learnedly Argued his Cale, infilting upon the hardship and length of his Lord-Thips Imprifonment, which had continued now for Five years. That in the Intervals of Parliament, the Kings Bench was the Supream Coprt, to which the Subject could have recourfe for his Liber-' ty: And that the Law did not leave any Subject under an Indefinite Confinement, without any remedy. That belides, the Earl of Danby had His Majefries Pardon, which was produced, and offered to the Court to be read; and they concluded with a Prayer, that the faid Earl might be, admitted to Bail; Then the faid Fardon was read, and fome of the Judges defired time till the next Term to confider of his Lordhips Cafe 3 which was wholly new to thein; But his Lordship praying they would pleafe to deliver their Opinions fome time this Term; the Court gave leave that his Lordships Councel should towards the end of the Term, move the Court to know their farther pleasure; and in the mean time his Lordship was remanded to the Tower.

Danby, according to the Rule of Court, fubmitting himfelf to His Majeffiel Pleas made this day Sevennight, was brought fure, and begging His Pardon; It was ordered that he should attend the Right Honourable the Earl of Sunderland, Lord-Lieutenant of the County of Warwick, and make fuch publick fatisfaction to the faid Deputy-Lieutenants, and Militia-Officers, as his Lordship should judge fit; and that thereupon he should be discharged from the cultody of the Mellenger. And accordingly Mr. Archer attended his Lordship on Monday last, and was te-quired by his Lordship, in pursuance of His Majesties Order in Council, to make his fubmission to Sir Thomas Price, Sir Charles Lee, and Thomas Lucy, Elq; three of the Deputy-Lieutenants, who were there prefent, in the name of all the. Lieutenancy of that County, which he did, exprelling much forrow for his rath act in affixing the Paper before-mentiony ed, and promifing to behave himfelf with all Obedience to the King, and fubmiffion to His Officers; upon which he was difcharged.

Westminster, Feb 6. This day John Hambden, Efg; came to his Tryal at the Kings Bench Barr, upon an Indictment of High Mildemeanor, to which he had pleaded the last Term, and was found Guilty of the fame. The whole Tryal will very fuddainly be made publick by my Lord Chief Justice his appointment.
