**A**T the Council-Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 5th day of *January* 1833.

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council.

**W**HEREAS by an Act, passed in the second year of the reign of His present Majesty, intituled "An Act for the prevention, as far as may be possible, of the disease, called the cholera, or spasmodic, or Indian cholera, in England," it is, amongst other things, enacted, that it shall and may be lawful for the Lords and others of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, or any two or more of them (of whom the Lord President of the Council, or one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State for the time being, shall always be one), by any Order or Orders to be by them from time to time made, to establish, and again, from time to time; by any such Order or Orders, to revoke, renew, alter, or vary all such rules and regulations, or to substitute any such new rules and regulations, as to them may appear necessary or expedient, for the prevention, as far as may be possible, of the spreading of the said disease, called the cholera, or spasmodic, or Indian cholera, in England or Wales, or any part thereof, or for the relief of any persons suffering under, or likely to be affected by, the said disease:

And whereas it is further enacted by the said Act, that all and every the expences which may be reasonably and properly incurred, in carrying into effect any Order of the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, made as aforesaid, shall, under and by virtue of an order in writing of some justice of the peace, dwelling in or near the parish or division (and which said order any such justice is thereby empowered and directed to make, commanding the churchwardens, overseers, or guardians of the poor for the time being, to pay a certain sufficient sum of money for such purpose), be defrayed out of the rates for the relief of the poor of the parish, township, or extra parochial place maintaining its own poor, in which the same shall be incurred, and, in other extra parochial places, out of the poor's rate of the parish nearest adjoining:

And whereas the said disease hath extended to the township of *Knarborough*, and other parts of *Great Britain* have been and may be affected by the same:

And whereas by two several Orders in Council, made on the sixth day of *March* and the nineteenth day of *July* last past, by the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council (of whom the Lord President of the Council was one), it was, amongst other things, ordered and directed, that every Board of Health, constituted by an Order of the Privy Council, should and might apply to the select or parish vestry of the parish, township, ecclesiastical division, district, or place, for which such Boards of Health are appointed, for authority and powers to carry into effect the sanitary purposes of the Act before recited, and the measures of preparation and precaution in the said Orders described, and to provide a certain sufficient sum of money for the discharge of the necessary expences thereof, of which the amount should be declared and fixed by the said vestries:

And whereas it hath been represented to their Lordships, that estimates, accounts, and vouchers, containing a detailed statement of all the necessary expences, and a request for the funds to meet them, amounting in the whole to the sum of sixty pounds, have been submitted and made by the Board of Health for *Knarborough*, and *Scriven* with *Tentergate*, to the vestry meetings of the township of *Knarborough* and the township of *Scriven* respectively, such vestries being severally and duly convened; when the vestry of the township of *Knarborough* consented to grant to the said Board of Health the sum of forty pounds ten shillings, being its proportionate share of the said sum of sixty pounds; but the vestry of the township of *Scriven* declined to comply with the requisition of the said Board of Health for the sum of nineteen pounds ten shillings, their proportion of the said sum of sixty pounds; such several sums being applied for by the said Board from the different townships aforesaid, to provide for the just expences incurred in carrying into effect the sanitary purposes of the before-recited Act, and the measures of preparation and precaution prescribed in the before-mentioned Order of their Lordships founded thereon:

It is, therefore, ordered, by the Lords and others of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council (of whom *Viscount Melbourne*, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is one), in pursuance of the powers vested in them by the before-recited Act, that so much of the Orders in Council of the sixth day of *March* and nineteenth day of *July* last past, as requires the amount of the sum to be defrayed in discharge of the necessary expences of such sanitary measures to be fixed and declared by such vestries as aforesaid, be, and they are hereby, revoked and altered, in so far as respects the said township of *Scriven*, and the said sum of nineteen pounds ten shillings:

And that the said Board of Health for *Knarborough*, and *Scriven* with *Tentergate*, shall and may, and they are hereby authorised and empowered to make application, by their chairman or secretary, to some justice of the peace living in or near the parish or division, to make his order, in writing, upon the parish officers, guardians of the poor, or district churchwardens of the said township of *Scriven*, commanding them to pay the said sum of nineteen pounds ten shillings, for the purposes aforesaid, out of the rates levied, or next hereafter to be levied, for the relief of the poor of such parish; which said order such justice of the peace is hereby required and enjoined to make, in pursuance and exercise of the powers vested in him by the before-recited Act; and the said parish officers, guardians of the poor, or district churchwardens, are hereby ordered and commanded to pay such sum of money in obedience to the order of such justice, in the manner therein directed, or they will incur the penalties consequent upon disobedience to such before-recited Act, and to the present Order:

And the Lords and others of His Majesty's Privy Council (of whom *Viscount Melbourne*, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State,

is one) do hereby declare, that for all acts, deeds, matters, and things properly done by such Board of Health, justice of the peace, overseers, churchwardens, guardians of the poor, and others His Majesty's subjects, in execution and furtherance of this present Order of the Lords and others in Council, or of any order so to be made by any such justice as aforesaid, this Order shall be their full and sufficient warrant.

HALF-PAY TO NAVAL OFFICERS AND OFFICERS OF THE ROYAL MARINES.

**N**OTICE is hereby given, that on the receipt in the Wages Department at the Admiralty-office, Somerset-place, of the affidavit required from each Officer by His Majesty's Orders in Council, a bill for the amount of the half-pay due will be made out in this Department, which will be payable by the Treasurer of His Majesty's Navy, on the following days, viz.

On the 21st, 22d, and 23d of January, to Admirals, Captains, Commanders and Retired Commanders, and their Attorneys.

On the 24th and 25th of January, to Lieutenants at 7s. and 6s. a day, and Chaplains, and their Attorneys.

On the 28th, 29th, and 30th of January, to all other Lieutenants, and their Attorneys.

On the 31st of January and 1st of February, to Masters, Surgeons, and Pursers, and their Attorneys.

After which the half-pay will be payable on the first and third Wednesday in every month.

Officers residing in or near London, and wishing to receive their half-pay in person, are requested to transmit their affidavits to the Secretary of the Admiralty immediately on the expiration of each quarter; also those employing agents should as promptly furnish their agents with their affidavits, as unless such documents are early delivered into this Office, delay in the payment must unavoidably ensue.

Where Officers are abroad on leave, their agents are to produce their letters of leave, or attested copies thereof, before the half-pay can be paid.

Or (under the authority of the Statutes relating to the pay of the Navy) they may receive it in any of the following ways, viz.

- 1st. By drawing a bill for the amount.
- 2d. By a remittance bill, payable to them at or in the neighbourhood of their residence.
- 3d. By extract, upon which those Officers who reside in the neighbourhood of a Dock-yard, where there is an establishment of Pay Clerks, may be paid.

If they wish to receive it by bill of exchange, they are to give notice thereof, by letter, to the Secretary of the Admiralty, marked, in the corner, "Half pay, Accountant-General," and thereupon the proper form will be sent to them.

If they wish to have it remitted to them, they must give a like notice to the Secretary of the Admiralty, marked in the same manner, and a bill will thereupon be made out and transmitted to them.

If they reside near a Dock-yard, and desire to receive it there, they are to give notice of such desire to the Superintendent, in order that the necessary measures may be taken for obtaining the requisite extract from the Half-pay List, and the consequent authority for payment.

In all cases, the Officer signifying his desire of payment is to state at the foot of his letter, his Christian and surnames, his rank, and a full description of his residence.

MEM.—Bills of exchange drawn under or by virtue of the Act of 11 Geo. 4, cap. 20, are not liable to the stamp duty.

No persons residing out of His Majesty's dominions are entitled to the privileges of this Act.

**T**HE Trustees of the Liverpool Docks and Harbour hereby give notice, that the late surveys of the different channels to the said harbour are now completed, and that the following alterations have been made, and additional land-marks and

buoys have been placed in the situations described, and for the purposes hereafter mentioned, viz.

A new beacon is erected opposite to the entrance of the Formby Channel, in a line with the S. E. landmark, bearing from the said landmark N. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. by compass, in a line with the deep water of that channel, wherein the N. W. and Fairway Buoys are placed a little on the S. W. or inside of that line.

The old N. W. Beacon of the Formby Channel will remain until the 1st of March next, after which it will be taken down.

The Grange Swashway, now called the South Channel, having been found a very safe one, and to have at least eight to ten feet on the bar, at the Western Entrance, at low water, spring-tides, a beacon buoy has been placed in about four fathoms water, in a line with the Upper Lighthouse, at Hoylake, and the Grange Mill, in Cheshire, bearing S.  $\frac{3}{4}$  W. by compass, which beacon buoy also bears W. by N. from the S. E. Formby land-mark and a beacon which has been erected on the sand-hills, in front, with the same bearing.

The Floating Light Ship bears from this beacon buoy S. W. by W.  $\frac{1}{4}$  W. distant four miles.

The N. W. Buoy of Formby Channel bears from ditto N. N. E. distant five miles; and the W. Buoy of Jordan's Spit bears from ditto E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N. distant  $1\frac{1}{2}$  mile nearly.

At the western entrance of the Grange Swashway, or South Channel, a buoy, painted red, has been placed, on the Burbo side, and one painted black, on Jordan's Bank; and the like have been placed on each side of the eastern entrance of the said channel, the Fairway, or deep water, being about midway betwixt the said buoys.

A buoy, painted white, has been placed on the S. W. point, or corner, of the Four Feet Flats, in the Horse Channel; and a buoy, also painted white, has been placed on the eastern entrance of the Patch Shoal.

An additional buoy, painted black, has been placed between Spencer's Spit Buoy and the Black Buoy, on the North Bank.

At Hoylake two log buoys have been laid down, in the said channel, betwixt Helbre and the Red Stones.

Three improved lanterns, of a circular form, will be exhibited on the Floating Light Ship in a few weeks, which will be seen with greater brilliancy and effect than those heretofore used.

The Grange, or South Channel, will, in many cases, be found of the utmost advantage to the navigation of this port.
