Here are Letters from the Sicur Kunuky General of the Collacks, giving an account of a great Victory he hath obtained against the Torks and Tartars. The particulars are thus re-lated, The Encay were above 40000 flrong, commanded by two Tartar Generals, and Haley Bey a Turkilh Officer, who had under his orders a Body of Spahees and fome Companies of Janifaries; They had made a great march, with delign to fall upon the Poles and Coffacks in Podolia, and to relieve Caminies; whereof the General of the Coffacks, having received advice, he drew immediately together an Army of gobod men, and marching with them with great diligence, attacked the Enemy the 4th of the last month near Filgrotin, and defeated them with fo great a Slaughter, that togod of them were flain upon the place and in the purfuit. The Generals of the Tartars, who en-deavoured to rally their Troops were killed, toget .ther with the Kaymacan or Governor of Bialogrod, and to Myrzas (which are the Great Men and Principal Officers among the Tartars.) Haley Bey offered 100 thousand Crowns to fave his Life, but the Colfacks, into whole hands he fell, quarrelling about dividing the Money, they killed him in the heat of their dispute. After this Victory the Coslacks entred into the Country of the Tartars of Budziak, putting Men, Women and Children to the Sword and it's faid that they flew above 100 thousand. They released many thousand Christians which the Tartars had made Slaves during the last Campagne. and having finished their Tavage, took Bialogrod and Ketin, and put Garifons into those places. There are other Letters which fay, that the Walachians to the number of goooc, have fworn Fidelity to the King and Crown of Poland, and have likewife engaged themselves by Oath, in a defensive and offensive League with the Costacks against the Turks and Tartars : And that the Moldavians are entred into the fame Confederation, and have put themfelves under the Protection of the King of Poland, who has reftored the Hofpedar or Prince of Moldavia, that was fome years fince deposed by the Turks.

Madrid, January 6. The Flota from New Spain, which arrived at Cadiz the 14th of the laft Month, confifted of eight Sail, the Admiral, Vice-Admiral, and fix Merchant, Ships: Thele Ships have brought home a Million and half of Pieces of Eight for the King, and about 3 Millions for particular perfons, with good flore of Coehmel and Indigo; the reft that flaid behind to difpole of their Goods, are expected at Cadiz this or the next Moath. For news, They bring none that we hear of, unlefs it be, that the Governor of Vera Cruz, which place was plundered by the Pyrates about April laft, had by order of the Viceroy of Mexico, been eried and condemned to have his Head eut off. His Catholick Majefty hath given out Commissions for the raifing in this Kingdom three Regiments of Foot to confift each of 1000 men. From Alizent we have ad-

Madrid, Fanuary 20. ving put twice to Sea from Alicant, and been as often forced back again by contrary winds, they failed the third time, and were got as far as Cdpe de Gat, when they met with a very violent florm, which difperfed and very much fhattered them: The Admiral and one ship more returned to Alicant on the 4th Inflant, and we have an account that fer ven or eight more are put into Carthagena and Denia, but of the relt we have no news. We have advice that a French Man of War of 44 Guns hath been lately luft near the Island lviza, but that the men all faved themseives. Brom Libbonne we have an account, that the Queen of Portugal died the 27th of the laft month. The Letters from Cadiz of the 9th Inflant inform us, that the English fleet un or the Command of the Lord Darimouth, was still in Tangier Road. They fpeak here of fending a very confiderable supply of Money to the Marquis de Grana.

The 13th Inflant arrived bere the Prince Lubomirski from Hungary, and having the fame day an Audience of the Emperor, he acquainted his Imperial Majefly that he had received Letters by an Expteis from the Court of Poland, which gave him an account, That the General of the Colfacks having received advice that the Turks and Tartars had drawn together a body of 40000 men, with delign to fall juto Poland, he had immediately affembled what Forces he could, and advancing towards the Enemy, attacked them with fo much bravery, that he quickly broke their Body and differted them, and being joyned by a Body of Poles, they purfued the Enemy as many ways as they fled, and made fo great a flaughter of them, that the Earth was covered for feyeral milestogether with the flain, which are faid to have been at leaft 2000. That the Colfacks encouraged with this great Victory, had made Incurfions as far as the Black Sea, ravaging the Country of the Jartars of Budzisk and Oczanow, and fparing meither Sex nor Age; and that they had put Garifons into Bialogrod and Kerin, the firth being fituate on the Black Sea, and the other at fome diffance from it on the Nieller.

The Tryal having lasted till three a Clock in the afternoon, the Court role, leaving the Jury to give in a Private Verdict to one And this morning the faid lury of the Judges. delivered their Verdict to the Court, which was, That the faid Braddon was Guilty of the whole matter charged. in the Information ; and that Speke was Guilty of all the matter in the faid Information; except the Subornation.
