#### St. James's-Palace, March 27, 1833.

His Majesty was this day pleased to hold a Chapter of the Most Illustrious Order of St. Patrick.

The following Knights Companions, in their collars, assembled in the Entrée-room, viz. His Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland; the Marquess of Thomond; the Marquess of Sligo; the Earl of Roden; the Marquess of Downshire; and the Marquess of Clanricarde; attended by his Grace the Archbishop of Dublin, Chancellor of the Order; and Sir William Betham, Ulster King of Arms, in their mantles, chains, and badges.

At half past one o'clock, the Knights Companions were called over by Ulster, and proceeded into the presence of the Sovereign, who was seated in the chair of state, and the Knights Companions took their respective sears at the table, according to the order of their stalls.

By command of the Sovereign, the Marquess of Conyngham (already a Knight) was then introduced into the Royal Presence, and his Lordship, being received at the door of the Chapter-room by the Marquess of Downshire and the Marquess of Clauricarde, the two junior Knights present, was conducted between them to His Majesty, preceded by Ulster, bearing the ensigns of the Order upon a velvet cushion. The Marquess of Conyngham, kneeling near the Sovereign, the Chencellor administered the oath; and Ulster presenting on his knee, the ribband and badge of the Order. His Majesty, assisted by His Royal Highness the Duke of Cumberland and the Marquess of Thomond, the two senior Knights present, put the same on the Marquess of Conyngham's right shoulder, pronouncing the admonition; after which his Lordship had the honour to kiss the Sovereign's hand.

The Chapter being ended, Ulster, by command of the Sovereign, called over the Knights Companions, and a procession was made from the Royal Closet in the same order as before.

#### St. James-Palace, March 26, 1833.

The King was this day pleased to confer the honour of Knighthood upon Colunel George Tees-dale, of the 1st or the King's Regiment of Dragoon Guards, Companion of the Royal Hanoverian Guelphic Order.
