Vicana. Ēchtuary 5.. UR last Letters from Newfol, the Head Quarter of the Imperial Troops in Hungary, gave an account that Count Rabatz was marched with 10000 Men and several pieces of Canson to cut off the Convoy which the Basia of

Buda was fending to Newbeufel; fince which we are informed that the Imperialists having taken a Messenger who was carrying a Letter from the Bassa of Buda to the Governor of Newbeusel, which gave advice, That he was sending 200 Wagons with Provisions, under the Convoy of 6000 men to their relief, and ordered him to send out part of his Gatison to meet them; Count Rabata had upon this Information caused part of his Troops to advance under the command of Count Caraffa towards Newbeufel to secure the Passages thereabours, and had posted himself with the rest near Lewestz. Count Teckeley has fummoned the Nobility of Upper Hungary to joyn with him for the defence of their Country, throatning to treat those that do not with the greatest Severity; He has likewise written to all the Towns and Communities in Upper Hungary, to assure them of a powerful Protection the next Campagne. And it is reported that he hath taken the Castle of Ungwar in which was the

Count Humani, and that he hath put him to death.

Lintz, February 9. The Prince de Lubomirski, who during his stay here, assisted at several Conferences concerning the Preparations for the approaching Campagne, parted from hence some days agone in his return for Poland, having received 200000 Florins, as well for what was due to him on account of the T oops he brought the last year into the Emperors Service, as for the new Levies The Baron Zierowski, he has undertaken to make. the Emperor's Ambaffador to the Czars of Mofcovy is upon his departure; and the Baron Bedieke, whom his Imperial Majesty is sending to Perfix, will likewife begin his Journey in few days, had several reports of the Grand Viliers having been frangled on the 23th of December last at Belgrade, and the fame news comes now from Poland, lothat we begin to give credit to it. they write that the Troops of Lithuania had defir yed all the open places in Zipperland and about Esperies. And that Count Teckeley was marched towards Pordacke. What was faid of his having caused the Count de Humans's Head to be cut off, is not certain.

Ratubonne, February to. Our Letters from Liniz give us an account that the Count d'Altheim and the Baron d'Abele were parted from thence for Presbourg, and that the Duke of Lorrain would follow about the 18th of this month, a Great Council of War being appointed to be held at Lintz the 16th. The Letters from Husgary tell us, that the Turks having notice of the march of Gount Rabata, had for the present laid aside their design of sending the great Convoy they had prepared to Newbeusel, and that General Rabata was thereupon come back to Newfol. The fame Letters add, that 40 Sledges laden with Provisions, had in the night I what had been proposed to him by their Deputies,

Hamburgh, February 19. The Count de Lamberg, the Imperial Minister, is arrived at the Court of Saxony; from whence he is expected towards the latter end of this month at Berlin. From Copenbages they write, that the Commissions for the new Regiments the King has refolved to raife, are all given out, and that the Officers are gone to make their Levies. The Polith Letters cell us, that the Coffacks have made their Incursions as far as the Danube, where it falls in several Branches into the Black Sea ; and that they have made a very great spoil in those Parts. The king of Polund; according to these Letters, was still at Cracow, directing the Preparations for the next Campagne, which are faid to e very great.

Brussels, February 18, Monsieut Del Val is teturned hi her from Hanouer, and the Marquis de Hounsbrooke is in few days expected back from Monficur de Montal hath had this week, Cologne. a review of his Troops near the Callie of Sorle between the Sambre and the Meufe. And from Lilly we have an account that 10000 men will be drawn out of the new Conquelts and lent towards, Catalonia, where they are to serve under the command of the Mareschal de Belfonds. Our Letters from German and Venice tell us, that the Aga of the Janilaries, had, by order from the Grand Signior, strangled the Visier at Belgrade; that his Sueceffor was not yet named ; and that in the mean time the Caimacan had the direction of Affairs:
-- Bruffels, February 2 2. The Marquis de Grand nas fent Monsieur Del Kal to the Hague to assist as the Conferences that are held there. We have advice from Limburgs that the French have burne several Villages in that County . The Sieur Fort see bath again taken the general Farm of the Customs, for which he is to pay 1500 thousand Floring yearly.

Hague, February 14.
